*Schools survey parents and students alternating years on modes of travel; all schools did the survey this fall. Top 3 concerns were: 1) amount of traffic; 2) safety of intersections and crossings; and 3) tie: distance, weather or climate, and speed of traffic. Intern noticed a mismatch between distance and mode of travel. Staff offered to compare plan with parent feedback.*

*Staff asked about trees; Gallager said there is not room for tree boxes in the boulevard, but could possible include tree boxes in curb extensions. Can't do anything about WTC's curb extensions.*

- 4 **Discuss People For Bikes' Network Analysis Tool**

*Network analysis tool is based on OpenStreetMap. Staff requested assistance to make map of La Crosse up to date with bike infrastructure; suggested gathering to work on it together. Jim Longhurst suggested weekend of Midwest Active Transportation Conference (5/19).*

## 5 Discuss Open Streets during Bike Fest

*Staff has been working with Carolyn Dvorak on Open Streets event on Sunday, September for La Crosse Area Bicycle Festival. Proposed route goes from Cameron Park along 5th Ave. and Main St. to Burns Park.*

## 6 Schedule Bike Boulevard Design Workshops

*Current Hwy 53 Corridor Planning Process includes Avon St., so BPAC should address that soon (May); previously discussed doing 22nd St because of upcoming Jackson St. planning, so that could be next (Jul.); Farnham St. could be separate or together with 22nd St. (Jul. or Sep.). Longhurst suggested coinciding 22nd and/or Farnham Bike Blvd. planning with Holy Trinity - Longfellow Neighborhood Association meeting, 3rd Monday of the month.*
