To Whom it May Concern,

As a resident of La Crosse, a strong supporter of individual freedom, parental rights, and evidenced based medicine I strongly oppose the amendment for J&A 5.31.2022 regarding the banning of conversion therapy.

Subsection (a)(2) and (a)(3) references a prevailing opinion that has been chosen from sources which universally show one particular view of sex, gender, and gender ideology and an associated view of conversion therapy. Clearly a survey of the broader consensus looking at opposing opinions and considerations either wasn't done or was ignored. I will let the physicians who are far more qualified than myself and I know are writing in present evidence in depth.

Subsection (a)(4) bears no weight as the opposing literature reviews conducted on gender affirming therapy has shown know statistically significant reduction in harm, suicidal thoughts, or substance abuse.
