


Goals

Goal 2: To create a safe, welcoming, and inclusive space to hear the unsheltered population's voice and contributions about solutions.

Goal 3: To develop clear, consistent, and widely communicated policies and procedures to ensure effective service delivery and accountability.

Goal 4: Procure all funding needed.
