If you are involved in a fire, remember R.A.C.E. to help you respond safely and correctly:

- <u>**R**</u> = <u>**Rescue**</u> anyone in immediate danger from the fire, if it does not endanger your life.
- <u>A</u> = <u>Alert</u> the other residents that there is a fire. Also call <u>911</u> if the fire is not able to be extinguished.
- <u>C</u> = <u>Contain</u> the fire to the room or space of origin by closing doors and windows.
- **<u>E</u>** = <u>**Extinguish**</u> if safe to do so or <u>**Evacuate**</u> the building. Most fires start small and can be easily controlled in the early stages of the fire.

If the fire is too large or you do not confident in being able to control or extinguish it, you are to evacuate the building and congregate with the others to **2119 Sunset Ln**. Do not try to gather valuables as this behavior will put you in serious danger and could be fatal. Upon arrival of the fire department, you are to take instructions from them. Under no circumstances are you to re-enter to the building unless the Fire Department indicates it is safe.

PROPER USE OF A FIRE EXTINGUISHERS (P.A.S.S.)

To use the fire extinguisher correctly, remember the P.A.S.S acronym:

- **P** = **Pull** the pin on the fire extinguisher
- $\underline{A} = \underline{Aim}$ the extinguisher nozzle at the base of the fire
- <u>S</u> = <u>Squeeze</u> or press the handle
- **<u>S</u>** = <u>**Sweep**</u> from side to side until the fire appears to be out
