The following report will highlight some of the training accomplished during the month of June 2017.

- 1. All LCFD members have been training on various firefighting and EMS skills and working with probationary hires.
- 2. LCFD newest Lieutenants attended a 40-hour Fire Instructor 1 certification class.
- 3. Haz Mat Team- Our Hazardous Materials Team conducted their monthly skills training and trained with City Brewery.
- 4. Water Rescue- Conducted their monthly skills training at various locations in the river.
- 5. TEMS- The LCFD Tactical EMS members trained at the airport.
- 6. The LCFD USAR Team- attended their Quarterly Structural Collapse Training event.
- 7. Probationary Program- Five firefighters are currently in the Probationary Program and are working with the Training Department and crews to complete their necessary training.

On June 1st at 0800, the La Crosse Fire Department deployed 12 of its members as part of the state's Wisconsin Task Force 1 (WI-TF1) Urban Search and Rescue Team, to the Cambria WI explosion and structural collapse incident. Along with 55 other members from around the state, the team conducted Search and Recovery efforts through the night and into the morning of June 2nd until all persons unaccounted for were located.

WI-TF1 is an Urban Search and Rescue response task force designed to provide a coordinated response to disasters in urban environments, emphasizing on the location and extrication of victims trapped in collapsed structures. The task force is capable of responding to State and National natural and man-made disasters. WI-TF1 US&R Task Force is an asset owned & managed by the State of Wisconsin, Wisconsin Emergency Management.

The La Crosse Fire Department has 18 members on WI-TF1.
