



List your concerns about the David Olson petition. Please be specific and brief.

1. It rewards renters (who have owned it for decades) who have done nothing but squeeze dollars out of it until it has "no more sales value." Even the "good" rentals have little to offer in terms of neighborhood contributions. There must be a solution for the rental market that does not include the ongoing reduction of La Crosse neighborhoods to rental homes. It's a cycle that plagues the city. We need less of it, not more. Single families are looking for homes in the city, and the city needs them here. (I know, I just went through the painful process of trying to find an affordable home here. There are few. In the end, we bought a RENTAL and turned it back into a single-family, owner occupied home. That's what the city needs.) The strength of the city's neighborhoods relies on true investment in the community (rather than dollar extraction) from people who live in and keep up their homes. It is in the city's future management plan, as well as being in the city's best interest long term. Singlefamily, owner occupied homes are disappearing. Just ask the county or the city for the numbers. They will (sadly) inform you of the hundreds of such properties that have been turned over to rentals in just the past few years. And they can even inform you that a handful of landlords own hundreds of rental properties. Landlords rule this city. There needs to be a balance. Right now, there is not—to the detriment of the tax base, the school district and the quality of the neighborhoods. If it continues, what's to keep a family like mine here? It would be much easier to turn my beautiful new home back into a rental and move somewhere else that shows a stronger demonstration of shared community values.
