## **Police Department Monthly Report**

### In the News

On February 15<sup>th</sup>, the Sara Rose Hougom Foundation presented the La Crosse Police K-9 Unit with \$700 to be used for training and equipment. The funds were raised at the annual Spaghetti Dinner hosted by the Moose Lodge. Also on this day, the SRHF launched the new "Share the Love, Sara Style Backpack" program. Each area Law Enforcement Agency was presented with several "Sara Packs" loaded with school supplies, tooth brush/paste, a toy, stickers, snacks and more. Officers will be handing these Sara Packs out to area youth. It's a great way for area Law Enforcement to interact with children in the community.

In February, a group of Officers started a "Color with a Cop" donation drive for art and school supplies. All items collected were then donated to Hamilton Elementary, and the Officers volunteered their time to create art with the students. This was the second year that the Officers organized this type of event with Hamilton.

On March 3<sup>rd</sup>, eight La Crosse Police Officers were "Freezin' for a Reason" when they jumped in the Mississippi for the 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Polar Plunge. The team raised \$1,545 for Special Olympics Wisconsin!

Near the end of March, Investigators and the Emergency Response Team executed a search warrant at 425 Johnson Street. Investigators arrested Deante L. House and recovered a loaded semiautomatic handgun, over \$11,000 worth of drugs including cocaine, meth, heroin, and marijuana, as well as over \$4,700 in cash. Follow-up investigation into House's second home in Onalaska led to the recovery of an additional \$20,000 worth of drugs (meth and cocaine) and over \$25,000 cash.

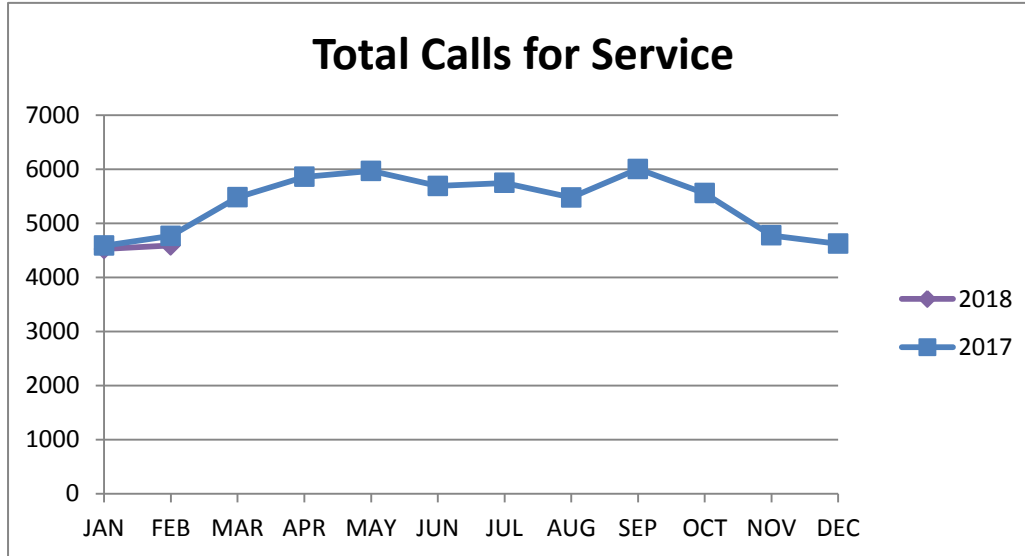

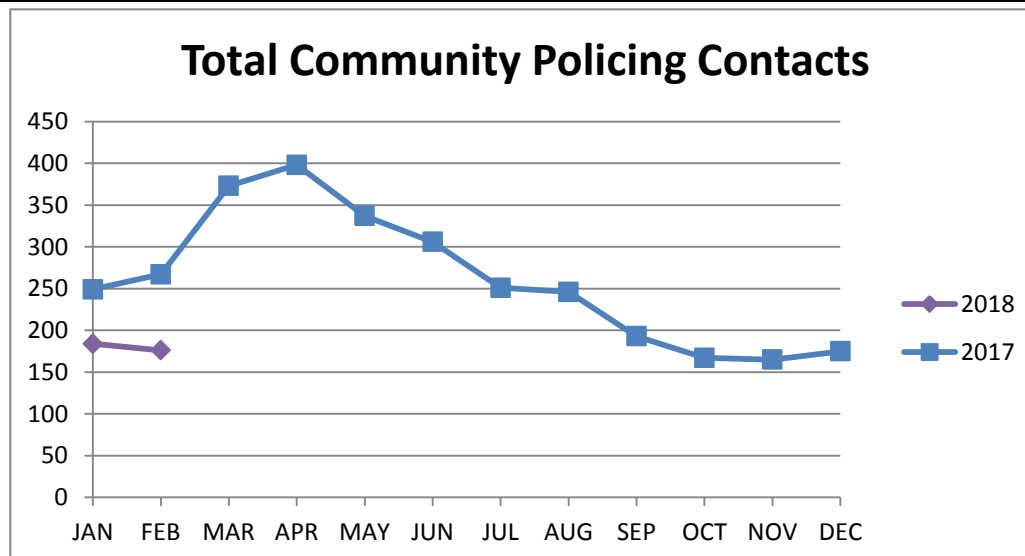
FEBRUARY 2018 YTD
