In the News:

4/9/18	Members of the La Crosse Fire Department's Technical Rescue Team rescued a woman stranded on a quarry face in Crawford County.
4/12/18	La Crosse fire and police investigators are working to find out what caused a fire that burned a half-acre of brush and swamp grass on the city's North side.
4/28/18	A faulty grill is blamed for a deck fire that damaged a North Side home Friday. LCFD responded to 710 Saint James Street at 12:36 p.m. where they extinguished a fire on the deck and ventilated the residence.
4/28/18	La Crosse Fire Department, along with West Salem & Town of Campbell Fire Departments, assisted the Onalaska Fire Department using MABAS for a fire located at Stoney Creek Hotel.
4/29/18	No one was injured in a fire that damaged a South Side home at 402 19 th St S. Firefighters found heavy smoke and fire coming from the rea of the two-story home.
4/30/18	Firefighters were called to 1421 West Ave S at 11:26 p.m. and found a "rapidly extending fire" in the rear of the two-story home. The fire was quickly extinguished.




