

 - In 2017, the Fire Prevention efforts of the LCFD reached over 70 events and provided fire prevention information to over 6,500 people
 - Life Safety Inspections
 - The LCFD/FPBS performs over 6,000 annual life safety inspections in all commercial and residential properties with three or more living quarters. All inspections are done per State Fire Code requirements.
 - Fire Investigations
 - The LCFD Fire Investigation Division averages 40
 Cause and Origin Investigations annually. Our three fire investigators are certified by national standards to the International Association of Fire Investigators
 Certified Fire Investigator and Fire Investigative
 Technician levels.








2017 Incident Count by NFIRS Description





La Crosse Fire Department 90th Percentile- Travel time 2017


