#### In the News:

9/6/18 Members of the La Crosse Fire Department collected money on the streets of La Crosse or the annual Fill the Boot fundraiser on behalf of the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

9/10/18 Congressman Ron Kind honored a La Crosse firefighter for her work in creating an assistance program, part of the Congressman's 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Old-Fashioned Corn Roast in West Salem Monday night. Renee Christensen created an aid program for firefighters injured on the job or receiving medical attention. Renee coordinates goods, materials and services to be given to those families.

9/12/18 The tires of a semi-truck caught fire at about 4 a.m. Wednesday between Exit 3 and Exit 4 on Interstate 90. The fire caused a brief closure of the interstate. The truck, owned by MBM Logistics/ TLM Express in Wilton, was carrying flour and sustained minor damage to the rear of the trailer and tires, according to the La Crosse Fire Department. The cause of the fire was likely mechanical failure of the tire or braking components, according to the fire investigators.

9/18/18 Wisconsin Urban Search and Rescue team tests skills in live training scenarios. Wisconsin Task Force-1 has a total of 74 members, including 15 La Crosse firefighters, who worked together to improve their knowledge. Urban Search and Rescue is a combination of specially services that are trained for confined space, technical rescue, rope rescue, boat operations, swift water operations, and structural collapse.

9/22/18 People in La Crosse could meet the firefighters who keep them safe during the La Crosse Fire Department Open House on Saturday at Station 3, across from Central High School. Visitors could get a closer look at the station and its equipment during the event and also get more fire safety tips from experts.







The IAAI-CFI (Certified Fire Investigator) is a certification granted through the IAAI (International Association of Arson Investigators). This Pro-Board certification takes approximately five or more years to obtain and requires extensive training and classroom activities showing extensive proficiency in the job of fire investigations. A candidate must complete 150 certified points as designated by the IAAI, including at least five courtroom testimonies, or the completion of a grueling weeklong courtroom testimony course. An extensive proctored examination of 150 questions covering six professional publications is taken by the candidate after their application is submitted and accepted by the IAAI-Board. Assistant Chief Snyder passed the Pro-Board exam on September 25<sup>th</sup>, and is the second IAAI-CFI in the history of the La Crosse Fire Department (first being Captain Kyle Soden). Assistant Chief Snyder and Captain Soden are two of 44 IAAI-CFI's in the State of Wisconsin.


