Police & Fire Commission Fire Department Monthly Report November 1st – November 30th

In the News:

- A La Crosse Fire Department ladder truck crew multi-tasked; helping string Christmas lights on a tree for Rotary Lights and practicing with equipment at the same time. Two firefighters took large spools of lights up in the bucket and unwound them as they maneuvered the bucket.
- 11/12 La Crosse Fire Department addresses cancer; the leading cause of death among firefighters. Sixty-one percent of firefighter line-of-duty fatalities were linked to cancer diagnoses between January of 2002 to March of 2017, according to the Firefighter Cancer Support Network. During the last year to assist with prevention methods, La Crosse Fire Department has installed specialized washers to make sure carcinogens are being removed and exhaust collection devices, both of which are now installed in all stations.
- 11/16 Aptiv representatives led team members from all La Crosse Fire Department locations in community awareness training, going over potential scenarios and encouraging positive interactions with people with cognitive disabilities.
- 11/20 The La Crosse Fire Department responded to a struck gas line call in the morning at the 800 block of Liberty Street. Homes were evacuated on the west side and remaining buildings were ordered to shelter in place. The leak was secured and thankfully there was no fire or explosion.
- 11/27 Crews responded to a fire caused by a malfunctioning dehumidifier. La Crosse Fire Department reminded citizens that dehumidifiers should be regularly cleaned to avoid buildup, plugged directly into an outlet, not an extension cord, and placed way from walls and furniture.
- 11/28 Four area departments, including La Crosse, are asking residents to help "Keep the Wreath Green" The annual campaign sets a wreath in front of the Losey Boulevard and Gillette Street stations. Each time the department responds to a structure fire, one of the green light bulbs on the wreath is changed to red.
