Sanitary Sewer Connection Fees.
THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of La Crosse do ordain as follows SECTION I. Section 46-82 is hereby created to read as follows: Sec. 46-82. - Sewer Connection

(a) Wastewater system connection fee. Each new connection to the City's wastewater treatment system shall be required to pay a connection fee to the City. The amount of the connection fee per residential equivalent connection (REC) shall be set forth in the City's fee schedule established by resolution and adopted by Common Council. The amount of the connection fee may be reviewed and updated by the Common Council from time to time to ensure that the fee reflects the amounts that the City has invested in its wastewater treatmen infrastructure and the current demand patterns of customers.

(b) Basis for connection fee. The City owns and operates a wastewater treatment plant and interceptor sewers and lift stations with capacity to serve additional customers. The purpose of the connection fee is to recover from new customers the cost of the available excess capacity in the utility system that has been paid for by the City and past and current customers. The amount of the connection fee is based on the total current value of the wastewater treatment plant and interceptor assets, the average day wastewater flow capacity of the entire system, and the average wastewater flow per day of a typical residential customer in the City.

(c) Residential equivalent

(c) Residential equivalent connections. A residential equivalent connection (REC) equals the estimated amount of wastewater discharged by a single-family home in the City on a daily basis. The connection fee for each new single-family home is based on 1.00 REC. The connection fee for other uses is based on the number of RECs assigned to the use. RECs are assigned to a new connection based on the estimated amount of average wastewater flow to be discharge by the new connection compared to that discharged by an average single
