Police Department Monthly Report

In the News

At the end of March we were pleasantly surprised to learn that the La Crosse Police Department was nominated for, and won, News Channel 8's "Best of La Crosse County" in the category "Best Employer 51-250 Employees"!

On March 23rd, members of the K-9 Unit participated in the United States Police Canine Association (USPCA) narcotics detection certification trials. All four patrol teams passed with flying colors. Officer Trent Bowe and K-9 Zaback even scored a perfect 200/200!

On April 29th, Chief Tischer and Officer Kurt Weaver graciously accepted a check for \$8,000 from State Bank of La Crosse. The funds were raised during the Chili Cook Off and are used for the Department's D.A.R.E. program.

On May 3rd, 19 officers and jailers took part in a 3-day Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training. Participants represented La Crosse, Campbell, and UWL Police Departments; La Crosse and Vernon County Sheriff's Offices; and La Crosse County Jail. The training educated these officers and jailers about mental illness so that in times of crisis, they are able to recognize various issued and utilize de-escalation techniques.

to "deal" with the Police Department. The unknown police officer came over and handed my daughter his badge to hold to help her calm down. Officer Hagen told her that they would not call me. I just have to say thank you for providing that kind of commitment to the city of La Crosse. Especially with the stigma behind cops, I want my daughter to grow up knowing that cops are not bad at all. So just know, that you have a resident in La Crosse who has a deep appreciation for everything the City of La Crosse Police Department does for the City."

On Saturday, March 2nd, several Officers took the plunge and were "Freezin' for a Reason" at this year's Polar Plunge, raising over \$2,200 for Special Olympics Wisconsin.

On March 22nd, four Officers participated in Aptiv's "Game On! 2019" game night to raise funds to benefit Aptiv and the individuals they serve. The LCPD team raised over \$4,300 and competed against other teams, playing common board and trivia games. While the LCPD team didn't win, they had a great time helping out an area organization!

On March 30th, off duty Sergeant Phil Martin and his family were enjoying time at the Cranberry Lodge in Tomah. While at the indoor pool, a small child was found unresponsive, blue and not breathing. A husband and wife pulled the child from the pool, and Sgt. Martin took immediate action, performing CPR on the child. He was able revive him as first responders took over. With the help of all these people, the child has made a full recovery.

It is with great sadness that we share the passing of retired police K-9 Ralph. Ralph was sworn into service in January 2008 and was the first K-9 we'd had a K-9 team since 1980. Ralph served LCPD for over 8 years with handlers Officer Ryan Fitzgerald before he was promoted, and then Officer Tony LeQue.




STATISTICAL ANALYSIS MARCH 2019 YTD
