Resolution authorizing public improvement and levying special assessments against benefited property in La Crosse, Wisconsin for Storm Water Conveyance System at 4451 El Camino Real Drive.

AMENDED RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on August 26 September 3, 2019 a report was prepared and adopted by the Board of Public Works on the proposed public improvements consisting of Storm Water Conveyance system at 4451 El Camino Real Drive.

WHEREAS, the assessments against benefited properties, and said report, are on file with the City Clerk, and

WHEREAS, on September 5, 2019, the Finance and Purchase Committee of La Crosse, Wisconsin, held a public hearing for all interested persons concerning the report of the Board of Public works, this resolution and the proposed assessments against benefited property, and all persons who desired to speak at the hearing were heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Common Council determines as follows:

It is expedient and necessary and for the best interest of the City of La Crosse and for the property affected thereby, that said properties be improved at the expense of the <u>City</u> benefited by the construction of a storm water conveyance system.

The Council exercises its police power to levy special assessments upon property for benefits conferred upon such property.

The report of the Board of Public Works, incorporated herein as if fully set forth herein, including the plans and specifications and assessments set forth therein, is adopted and approved.

The Board of Public Works shall advertise for bids and supervise construction of the improvements in accordance with the report hereby adopted and take such other and proper steps to effectuate this resolution.

Payment for the improvements shall be made <u>from existing cash in the Special</u> <u>Assessments Fund (Fund 482) and the Storm Water Utility.</u> by assessing the entire cost to the property benefited as indicated in the report.

The Council determines that assessments shown on the report represent an exercise of the police power for the health, safety and general welfare of the City and its inhabitants and have been determined on a reasonable basis and are hereby confirmed.

Assessments may be paid in cash or shall be payable over a period of ten years or fifteen years to the City Treasurer. Installments shall be placed on the next tax roll after the due date for collection and shall bear interest at the rate established by the Council per annum on the unpaid balance from January 1st of the year following the levy.
