In the News

On October 21st, members of the La Crosse Police Department volunteered their time for the annual "Tip A Cop" fundraiser for Special Olympics Wisconsin. The fundraiser, which is held at Texas Roadhouse, is a great way for Officers and Athletes to work together to serve our community. The fundraiser ensures that area Athletes can participate in year-long Special Olympics activities.

For the third year, the Apartment Association of the La Crosse Area held the Meatball Dinner, Silent Auction and Bake Sale to benefit the LCPD K-9 Unit. The Handlers and K-9s had a lot of fun interacting with everyone who attended the event.

Personnel

On October 29th, Officer Ryan Stenslien was dispatched to a 911 hang up on the south side of La Crosse. Dispatch advised the number did not have any previous contact history making it very difficult to figure out who it belonged to. Officer Stenslien did additional investigation and discovered the phone belonged to an individual who has past known suicide attempts. Officer Stenslien and Officer Todd Fischer attempted to make contact at this individual's listed address. Upon arrival, they found the individual seated in the front seat of a running car inside the garage. The individual was bleeding profusely from a self-inflicted wound to the wrist. Officer Stenslien and Officer Fischer acted quickly by applying first aid and requesting medical services. The actions of these two outstanding Officers ultimately saved this individual's life!

Officer Justin Eddy was dispatched to a welfare check on November 4th where a male party holding an infant child near the river was acting strangely. Upon arrival the male and child were gone but a second call came in with a new location. Officer Eddy contacted this male who had the child in his arms. He became defensive immediately, even after being told he is not in trouble and the Officer just wanted to make sure he was okay. When the male began to make threats towards his own child other

Officers were requested to assist. It was at this time Officer Chuck Frandsen noticed a boxcutter in the same hand the male was carrying the child with. Officer Tyler Pond was then able to establish a rapport with the male, convincing him to hand over the knife and the child. Officer Alex Burg was able to safely return the child to the mother, and the male was taken to a local medical facility for a mental health evaluation.

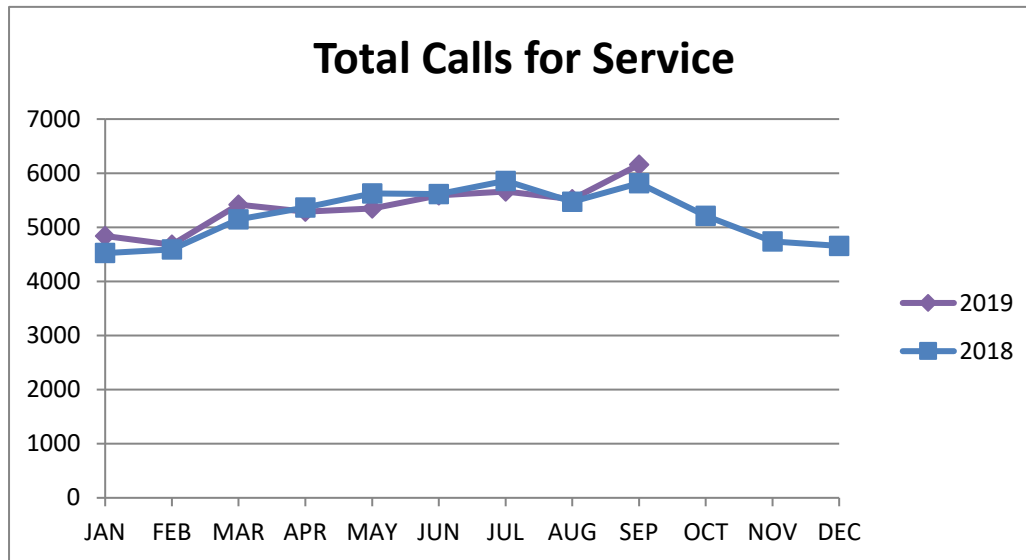

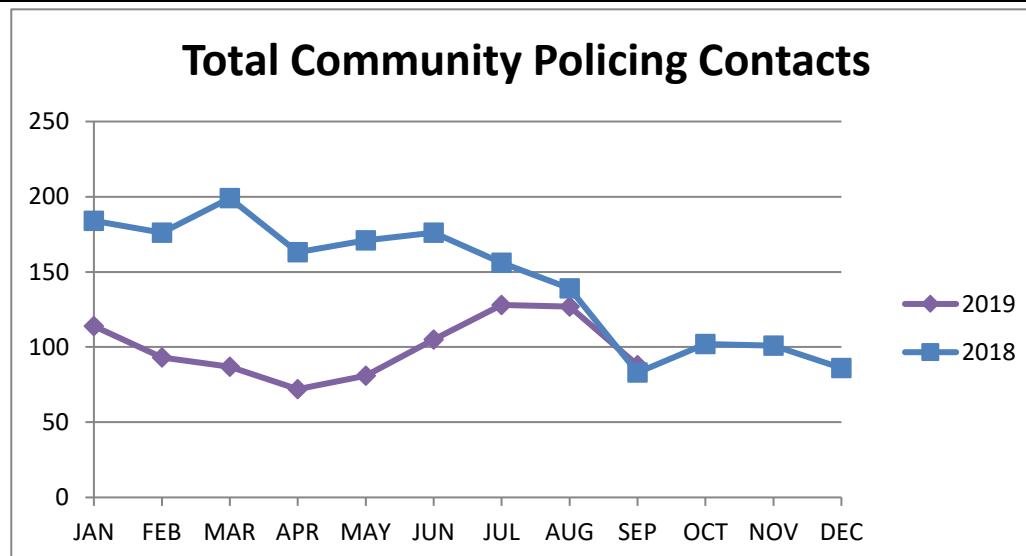
SEPTEMBER 2019 YTD
