## **Biosolids Disposal Summary Spring 2020**



- March, 6<sup>th</sup> City of La Crosse WWTP had about 10-14 days of Biosolids storage left.
- March 9<sup>th</sup> BPW approved A-1 Advanced Pumping as a contractor for disposal of biosolids as DNR other methods of disposal. (A-1 Advanced Pumping's facility is DNR Permitted for City of La Crosse Biosolids)
  - March 11<sup>th</sup> A-1 Advanced Pumping Started Hauling Biosolids by March 15<sup>th</sup> A-1 had hauled 1.97 Million Gallons to DNR permitted ag tank as other methods.
- March 16<sup>th</sup> BPW approved entering into an agreement with A-1 Advanced Pumping to manage Biosolids Program for the City of La Crosse.
- March 16<sup>th</sup> contractor hauled 800 yards of Cake to the Landfill for disposal.
- April, 1<sup>st</sup> A-1 Advanced Pumping started hauling Biosolids to DNR approved fields and to there tanks as other methods for disposal.
- April, 23<sup>rd</sup> A-1 Advanced Pumping had completed disposal of Biosolids from La Crosse WWTP please reference spread sheet for total gallons hauled.
  - A-1 Advanced Pumping hauled 5.6 MG of Biosolids from April 1<sup>st</sup> to April, 23<sup>rd</sup>, this totally emptied WWTP storage system. A-1 will return in 2 weeks to dispose of the remainder of biosolids produced.
  - Note La Crosse WWTP produces 35,000 gallons/day of liquid biosolid's about 12 million gallons a year.
  - Note it was a total gallon hauled spring 2020 to date 7.5 million gallons hauled off Isle La Plume in 15 working days equaling 1,518 truckloads.
  - In the12 years of working at La Crosse WWTP I've never seen the storage tanks so empty.
