



PROCLAIMING CITY OF LA CROSSE'S PARTICIPATION IN AMICUS BRIEF TO SUPPORT SAFER AT HOME ORDER

- WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 to be a public health emergency of International concern; and
- WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Tony Evers declared a state of emergency for the State of Wisconsin concerning the global pandemic, COVID-19; and
- WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald Trump proclaimed a National emergency concerning COVID-19; and
- WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) Secretarydesignee Andrea Palm issued Emergency Order #12 – the "Safer at Home" order, which requires our citizens to stay at home during the crisis with few exceptions; and
- WHEREAS, on April 2, 2020, City of La Crosse Mayor Tim Kabat declared a public emergency for the City of La Crosse concerning the global pandemic, COVID-19; and
- WHEREAS, on April 16, 2020, Wisconsin DHS Secretary-designee Palm extended the "Safer at Home" order until May 26, 2020 in order to continue State and local efforts to combat the spread of COVID-19; and
- WHEREAS, the authority of the Wisconsin DHS has been challenged by the Wisconsin State Legislature with a lawsuit before the Wisconsin Supreme Court; and
- WHEREAS, inhibiting the Wisconsin DHS authority to immediately and comprehensively respond to a statewide health emergency will lead to a slow, chaotic, confusing, and ineffective patchwork of local health responses; and
- WHEREAS, this challenge will result in surges of unnecessary COVID-19 infections and deaths throughout the State, reversing the progress and forfeiting the sacrifices all Wisconsinites have made to combat this virus.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM KABAT, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF LA CROSSE, do hereby join the City of La Crosse with an amicus brief to maintain Wisconsin DHS Secretary-designee Palm's extension of the "Safer at Home" order; and
