AN ORDINANCE

THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of La Crosse do ordain as follows:

SECTION I: Sec. 2-402(b)(14) is hereby added:

- (14)<u>Mitigate climate change and adapt to our changing environment by meeting the Natural Step's</u> four systems conditions:
 - a. <u>Reduce dependence upon fossil fuels, extracted underground metals and minerals.</u>
 - b. <u>Reduce dependence on chemicals and other manufactured substances that can</u> <u>accumulate in nature.</u>
 - c. <u>Reduce dependence on activities that harm life sustaining ecosystems.</u>
 - d. Meet the hierarchy of present and future human needs fairly and efficiently.

SECTION II: Sec. 2-403(c)(4) is hereby amended:

(4) Analyze economic development trends, review, develop and recommend economic development policies, ordinances and programs and facilitate activities to improve the economic climate of the City of La Crosse <u>while reducing carbon emissions and increasing renewable</u> <u>energy use</u>.

SECTION III: Sec. 2-404(d)(9) is hereby added:

(9) Align with the City's carbon neutrality efforts.

SECTION IV: Sec. 2-404(e)(5)k.-s. is hereby added:

- k. Whole-building energy modeling (BEM) for new construction and building retrofits
- I. Renewable energy, including solar photovoltaics, geothermal, and wind energy
- m. Microgrid technology that can support renewable energy and energy reliability
- n. Green roofs that include gardens that can capture and retain stormwater
- o. Blue roofs that capture and store stormwater to mitigate runoff effects
- p. <u>Under-parking water retention systems that capture and store stormwater to mitigate runoff</u> <u>effects</u>
- q. <u>Stormwater management best practices that are above the State mandate</u>
- r. Purple pipe reclaimed water piping systems
- s. <u>Site-specific public art projects</u>

SECTION V: Sec. 2-404(e)(6)i.-j. is hereby added:

- i. <u>Energy efficiency improvements (including high-efficiency windows or shadings, energy efficient appliances, LED lighting, enhanced insulation, et cetera) within a building. These are expected in all TIF projects, but they are not TIF-eligible costs.</u>
- j. <u>Projects that increase the city's carbon emissions.</u>

SECTION VI: Sec. 2-404(h)(1)c. is hereby amended:

c. Demolition, <u>Deconstruction</u>, alteration, rehabilitation, repair or reconstruction of existing buildings, structures and fixtures, other than historic buildings and structures;

SECTION VII: Sec. 2-404(i)(3) is hereby amended:

(3) Promotion of sustainable practices in their construction and operation such as meeting LEED, <u>Net Zero Energy Building, Living Building, Energy Star, or Green Globes</u> certification requirements;

SECTION VIII: Sec. 2-404(I)(1)p.-q. is hereby added:

- o. Transportation Demand Management Plan for operations over 250 employees.
- p. Sustainability Plan for operations over 250 employees.

SECTION IX: Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid

by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this division shall not be affected.

SECTION X: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage

and publication.
