Professional Standards

From November 3 – 5, 2020, the La Crosse Police Department underwent re-accreditation by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group (WILEAG). Three WILEAG Assessors from other Wisconsin Police Departments spent the three days on-site reviewing the policies and practices of the La Crosse Police Department to ensure that LCPD continues to meet the standards of best professional practices set forth by WILEAG including the protection of the life, health, safety, and rights of the citizens that we serve. Upon completion of the on-site, the Assessors informed Chief Kudron that they will report back to the full WILEAG Board and recommend re-accreditation for the 6th time.

Staffing

Throughout COVID, the La Crosse Police Department has met each challenge with dedication, professionalism, and a little bit of ingenuity, particularly when it comes to recruiting and hiring. Without the ability to visit area universities, participate in career fairs, or host prospective candidates, we've turned to social media and virtual meeting tools for everything from recruitment to interviews to some of the testing. Where our "new normal" really hits home is during our official swearing-in ceremonies. In the past we've always looked forward to welcoming our new officers and their families, as well as the Mayor, Council, PFC, and members of our community to the ceremony. With COVID, we had to resort to virtual events. At first, we only had the ability to record the very small, socially-distanced ceremony and then share that with the families. However, most recently we've been able to invite family to join us via Lifesize. While this is not ideal, we're thankful that we've been able to make things work so that our Officers and their families get to experience the same special event that we've always celebrated in person together.

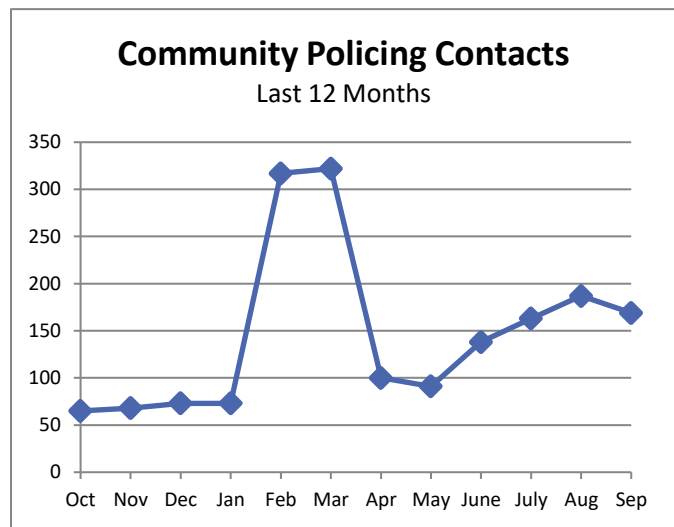
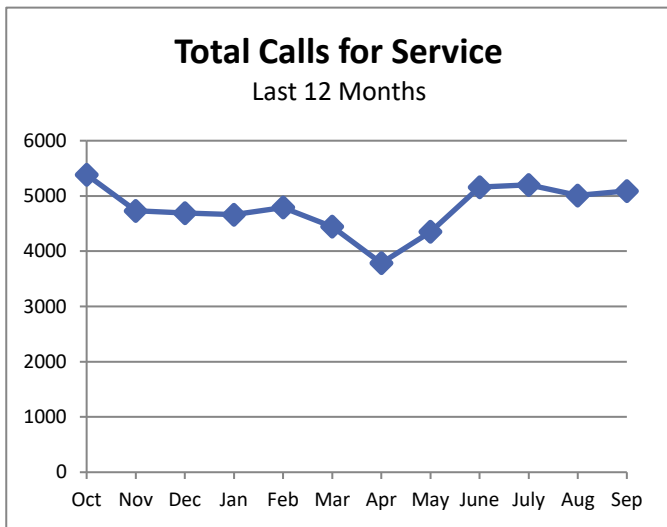

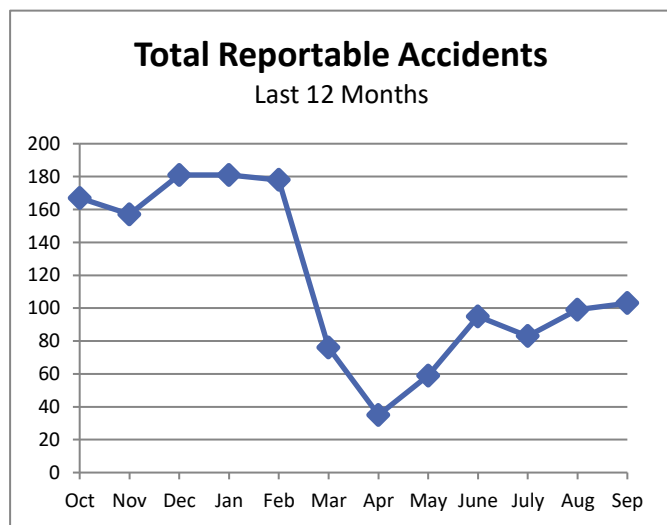
