Community Engagement

Employee Recognition

On June 12th, Sergeant Joe Wiegrefe received a phone call from a semi-truck driver. The driver had tried to deliver a pallet of chicken tenders to a local business, but because the pallet was damaged, the local business couldn't accept. However, the majority of the boxes of chicken tenders were still good, and the driver didn't want them to go to waste. Sgt. Wiegrefe and the driver brainstormed, reached out to the Hunger Task Force, and were able to deliver 2,450 pounds of chicken tenders. 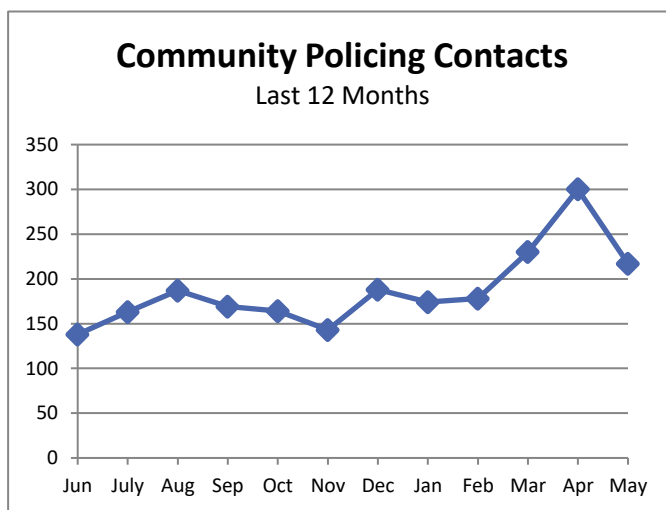
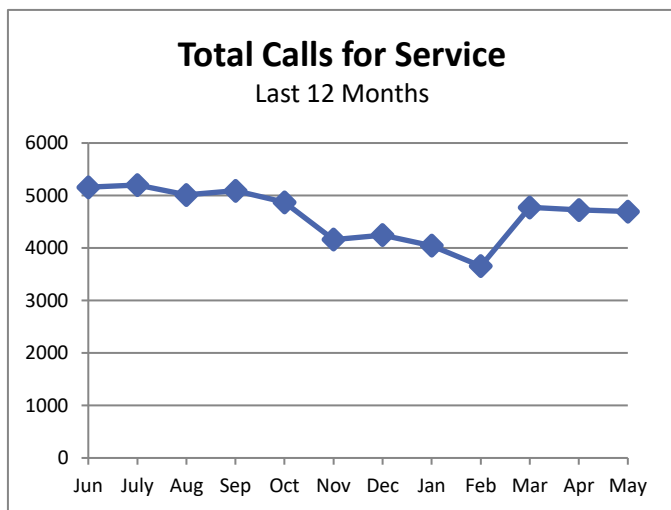

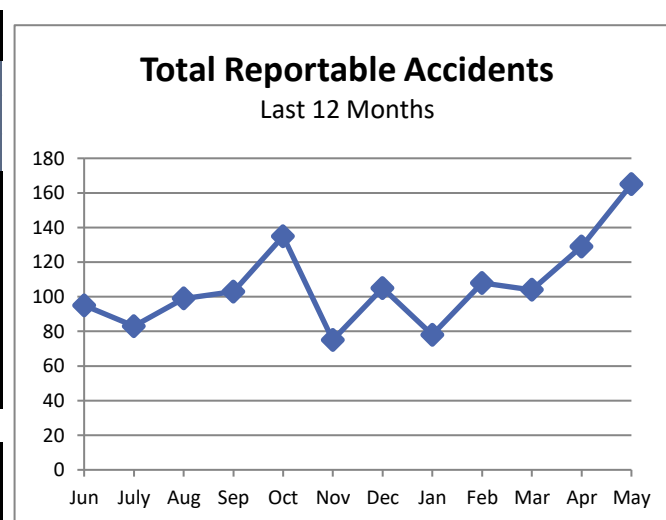
