Residents along ditch should be commended for how clear it has been this year. During the 7/19-20 storm, Waste Water Dept. removed debris from drain; will be working with Engineering to repair retaining wall at right angle. Kerns shared anecdotal evidence of how much better City fared compared to Shelby; no flood insurance claims in city. Bosshard cited cause of debris as construction site erosion from higher ground. Committee thanked Greeno's Dept. for fast response. Greeno refers to rain gauges for advanced warning; could compare to flow in channels, and measurements from Shelby and downstream in the future.
