Chair Smith reported that there are 2 companies that have submitted proposals. They both will be interviewed via phone and a recommendation will come back to the full board.

Economic Impact Study. There is a desire to see an independent 3rd party Economic Impact and Operational Study. CSL - John Kaatz are looking at the study. Parameters would be do have it all in for \$20,000 or less and have it done by the end of February for March introduction to the City Council. Moved by Phil Addis to approve with the parameters seconded by Pamela Maas and passed unanimously.

Architectural Fees were reviewed to have a better understanding of the Phase 1 fees for Pre Design and Concepts in relationship to the Phase 2 fees for Schematic Design and the overall project costs for ISG.

Review of concept and bolt ons by Will Kratt.....Mr. Kratt presented the quickly the LCC Board will need to make decisions on good/better/best options, bolt ons, room expansions, arena seating, deferred maintenance needs all in the very near future. It was determined to meet weekly in the month of February to keep up with the decision making process...Feb 5-12-19-26. Mr. Kratt also presented a financial tool which shows immediately what costs are added or subtracted from the project as decisions are made. Discussion on Branding/Marketing.....it was determined a RFP would need to go out as the schematic design gets to the end of its process. Also, a strong direction of getting staff input is needed for all the decision making processes. Fahey/ISG/Metre were directed to get this feedback.

#### President's Report

Mr. Smith reported that there is a desire to move forward with a capital fund raising campaign. It was suggested that we secure the assistance of a Fund Raising Professional. It was directed to reach out to some possible candidates and report back.

#### **Director's Report**

Fahey reported that the Center is in the process of filling 3 portions of Building Maintenance Engineer, Box Office Supervisor and Sales Representative. Also, reported that the organizer of the Minnesota Apple Growers is retiring. Replacement is yet to be determined. Early indications that this event would be moving back to Minnesota in the future.
