Residents are dealing with discrimination and housing complaints right now so its important to get this information out there, either in a training or a seminar/lecture. This is a complicated and difficult process, especially for residents that do not know their rights.

Some people from Consumer Advisory Council through a University extension used to host a Rent Smart program and they want to incorporate their personal experiences with renting and homelessness into future trainings to establish importance. - Could support UW Extension and have a more robust educational plan

Possible Topics:

- Recovering security deposits

- Guiding people struggling with homelessness through the renting process

There is not a lot of incentive for people to take the course anymore because landlords no longer use the course completion certificate as proof of being a responsible resident.

The course could reach other populations such as college students or average citizens.
