Arts Board guiding values and info:

- All members of the community should benefit from the Arts Board's work and support.
- Support programs and projects that benefit the community don't just fund projects coming to the board from a person who has an idea.
- Committee should further develop guidelines for development and implementation of arts proposals and working with other city departments (Parks, Streets, etc.)
- Continue to examine Arts Board's role with city and private projects, and with the community
- Ideas for general programs
 - Arts Directory DMI has a directory of artists Arts Board can promote
 - Public Art Inventory, to know what's in the city, what belongs to the city, maintenance needs, etc.
 - % for Art policies
- Framework for grant programs
 - Devote portion of grant funding to specific programs, such as:
 - Neighborhood development and implementation grants
 - Facade grants downtown org has grant program to improve facades (city funded)

City relationship:

- Work with Mayor and staff towards paid, dedicated staff for Arts Board, with a clear, thoughtful justification of the need for that expenditure
- Work with city fundraising staff on fundraising planning and ideas

Advocacy and process recommendations:

- Work with Polytechnic students re developing social media presence
- Focus on developing private partnerships to build advocacy for public art and creativity
 - Chamber of Commerce
 - La Crosse Center
 - Veterans and immigrant service groups

Nii Hosto Art Park

- Its purpose is to honor people who came before, provide a respite
- Approved April 2021, transferred to City Parks Department in November 2021
- Need an overall plan for the arts in the park, with a clear and transparent process to choose artists and art works for the park
- Are there currently ARPA funds from city for arts integration?
- Work with partners to keep moving forward with the park:
 - Army Corps of Engineers for flood plain and engineering studies to be able to Secure and anchor sculptures
 - Friends of the Marsh what kind of environmental issues should the Arts Board be aware of?
 - International Gardens
 - Chamber of Commerce/DMI -
 - City of La Crosse
 - Work with park staff to determine what needs to be done conceptually and logistically
 - Work with park's master plan towards arts integration
