Surveyor will wrap up current round soon; had 412 and added 20 more. Richmond asked if garages could be included. Kerns then offered to negotiate for a cheaper rate for garages; the next round would probably include 20-25 garages.

Brad Woznak walked through info sheet. The study uses regional regression equation developed by USGS and acknowledged by the DNR elsewhere. In order to change floodplain, City would need to: supply stream and rain gauge data (Weather Service rain gauge is usable), compare study to others in order to validate findings, and prove fault in DNR's existing rainfall runoff study. That process could take at least two years. Attendee asked if pursuing this was a waste of money, since DNR may not accept findings. Bosshart was undeterred. Becker brought up how the 1991 Ebner Coulee Study reduced the number of structures in the floodplain from 537 to 195. Neumeister encouraged a citywide approach; there is a request in progress to the Army Corps of Engineers to ammend the floodplain citywide. Richmond mentioned importance of having State legislators at these meetings. Kerns shared some floodplain legislation going through congress. The July storm was likely close to a 100-year flood. Fannie Mae and Freddy Mac won't sell mortgages to structures in the floodplain that are self-insured. Study didn't cover what acceptable mitigation can be used, but could do certified levees or walls. Jansen asked Engineering to work with consultant to develop options going forward. Lenz suggested asking for a formal response (i.e. Letter of Map Revision) to get some direction on what additional information the City needs to supply.
