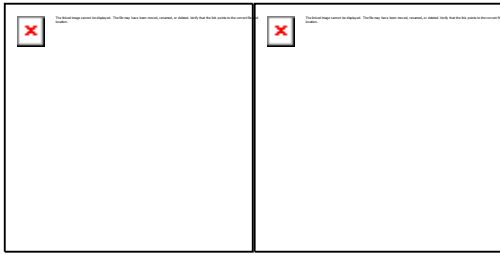

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Hello,

I am writing in regards to the attached documents I received in the mail, postmarked January 18th, 2022.

The document with the La Crosse Fire Department header details "The snow that fell between 12-26-21, and 1-6-22 was removed 1-8-22." According to the chart from weather.gov detailing snow accumulation in the La Crosse area, roughly seven inches of snow fell during this time:

The attached pictures we received from you clearly indicate that efforts had been made within this window of time to keep the sidewalk clear as there is a minimal amount of snow remaining on the sidewalk. Additionally, in the three years I have owned this property I had not received any complaints or notifications regarding my sidewalk maintenance until now, which indicates this has not been a recurring issue.

I understand the importance of keeping the sidewalks clear and am usually able to get it cleared within a handful of hours of the snow falling. This particular week my family was combating illness and clearing the small amount of snow that fell on 1/6/22 slipped my mind.

For the reasons detailed above, I am asking that you provide leniency in this one-time instance and forgive the amount owed in the attached invoice. I look forward to your response.
