Resolution approving a partial vacation of the alley located between Liberty Street, Charles Street and Gillette Street and Sill Street.

General Location

Council district 1, Logan Northside Neighborhood, on the south side of Gillette St, 3 ½ blocks east of Rose St, as depicted in MAP 22-1245. The alley is adjacent to a fire station and vacant land.

Background Information

The intention of this alley vacation is to combine parcels across the alley for a future fire station. The City has purchased seven parcels adjacent to and across the alley from the existing fire station. The alley is twenty feet wide and the portion to be vacated is 250 feet long. The vacation would allow the fire station redevelopment to spread across the alley. The vacation would impact the 11 parcels adjacent to the remaining alley who would only be able to get to their parking spaces and detached garages via Sill St. It would also force garbage and emergency service vehicles to back out of the alley.

Recommendation of Other Boards and Commissions


Consistency with Adopted Comprehensive Plan

The plan contains a Community Facilities objective to ensure provision of adequate fire protection services to residents and businesses in La Crosse. While not incorporated into the comprehensive plan, it's worth noting that the 2015 City's Transportation Vision memo generally discourages disconnections of the transportation network.

Staff Recommendation

Approval – The City approved the acquisition, demolition, and consolidation of parcels across the alley from the fire station; the alley is a step in the process of the fire station's redevelopment.



Would it be possible for me to speak at the Board of Public Works on Nov. 28th or Dec. 5th? I would like to get Board support to bring the *Hear, Here* project to the North end and to put the project into the 2024 Capital Budget. I plan to launch the project in April 2024 with 60 new signs/stories. The cost will be about \$40.000 which will be infrastructure only (more precise numbers will be available when I come to speak).

The benefit of this project to La Crosse's downtown have been that it brings in tourism dollars. Our phone data shows that people have called in to hear stories told about La Crosse from every state in the US, as well as Puerto Rico and Canada. It is also an international award-winning project that began in La Crosse Wisconsin and has been exported to Luxemburg Europe and London Canada. By bringing this to the North End tourism will be more readily drawn in that direction, and the uniqueness of the North End will be celebrated.

In the past I came to the Board of Public Works for the downtown *Hear, Here* project in May 2014 (14-0489) and March 2015 (15-0236).

Annual usage in April, May, June





Garden Pathway Project Proposal 10/24/2022

Overview: The proposed project would enhance the connection between the Schuh-Mullen neighborhood and the Kane Street Garden. The two are connected by a tunnel under the viaduct. Currently there is no indication that the garden is close to the neighborhood, and the tunnel is not very inviting or aesthetically pleasing. This project would enhance the appearance, create an intuitive connection, and involve the people living in the neighborhood in ways that increase neighborhood pride and connection to one another.

The plan: Lisa Mobley, a Schuh-Mullen resident and professional artist, will create the design and coordinate opportunities for neighborhood youth and families to participate in the creation of the pathway. Lisa will share design and make sure they are approved before initiating any work. Ideally the project would happen in the spring/summer of 2023 and would take 4-6 weeks. Neighborhood residents will have input on design and opportunities to paint and create the garden gateway.

Materials: Durable paint will be used to ensure the mural is weather resistant and lasting.

Maintenance: We expect the project as designed would last a minimum of 10 years without needing major repairs. Lisa Mobley will assume responsibility for minor maintenance that may occur.

Budget: We estimate this project can be completed for a cost of approximately \$3000. This would include paints, brushes, and other needed materials.

- Supplies including ladders, paint cups/buckets \$500
- Brushes and misc. needs \$400

Request: We are requesting funding up to \$3000



Is hereby authorized to discharge groundwater from the River Point District to the La Crosse Wastewater Treatment System pursuant to the effluent limitations, monitoring requirements, and other conditions set forth in this permit.

Compliance with this permit does not relieve the permittee of its obligation to comply with any or all applicable pretreatment regulations, standards, or requirements under Local, State, and Federal laws; including any such regulations, standards, requirements, or laws that may become effective during the term of this permit.

Non-compliance with any term or condition of this permit constitutes a violation of City Ordinance Chapter 46.

This permit is issued to the specific user identified above and shall not be reassigned, transferred, or sold to another user or to a different address.

PART 1 - GENERAL PROHIBITED DISCHARGE STANDARDS

Section 1 - City of La Crosse Pretreatment Standards

No person shall discharge or deposit or allow to be discharged or deposited into the wastewater treatment system any wastewater which violates the prohibited discharge standards found in City Ordinance Chapter 46 and briefly described as follows:

- **A.**Wastewater.....which has a closed cup flashpoint of less than 60 degrees Centigrade or 140 degrees Fahrenheit using test methods specified in **40 CFR 261.21**.
- **B.** Solid or viscous wastes, or wastes that may become solid or viscous in the sewer, and may interfere with the natural flow in a sewer or make excessive sewer cleaning necessary.......
- C. Garbage that has not been ground or reduced in size to such a degree that all particles are less than one-half (1/2") in any dimension......
- D. Noxious or malodorous liquids, solids, or gases.......
- **E.** Waste which may cause corrosion or deterioration of the wastewater treatment system. All wastes discharged into the wastewater treatment system shall have a pH value in the range of six (6) to nine (9) Standard Units at the point of introduction into the wastewater treatment system.......
- **F.**Fat, wax, oil, or greases.....which may solidify or become viscous at temperatures between 0 and 65 degrees Celsius, or 32 and 149 degrees Fahrenheit......
- G.Radioactive wastes or isotopes......
- **H.** Substances not removable by the wastewater treatment process which will cause discoloration, opacity, or foaming of the wastewater treatment plant effluent or residues.
- I.In no case shall wastewater with a temperature exceeding 40 degrees Celsius or 104 degrees Fahrenheit be introduced into the wastewater.......
- J. Unpolluted water including, but not limited to, non-contact cooling water, rain water, river water, or groundwater which will increase the hydraulic loading on the wastewater treatment system......
- **K.** Slug loads causing interference with wastewater treatment system.....or adversely affects.....residues, sludges, or scum.

- **O.** Liquids, solids, or gases which are likely to cause the wastewater treatment plant to violate WPDES standards.
- P. Any trucked or hauled pollutant, except at discharge points designated by the POTW.
- **Q.** Process wastewater containing pollutants exceeding the following concentrations as established on a continuous twenty-four (24) hour flow proportional basis or lesser period if process wastewater is discharged for less than twenty-four (24) hours in an average day of operation:
