Now, she has full access to the public right-of-way that she's help fund as a taxpayer. She's safe and separated from vehicle traffic because of that new sidewalk.

Stories like this happen hourly in my neighborhood. Finishing these fragmented sidewalks is absolutely crucial and should continue in 2025.
