

Resolution authorizing the sale of surplus and old equipment by departments.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Resolution 2011-08-037 addresses the Information Systems & Technology Department's policy to liquidate (sell) surplus, old, retired, and discarded equipment in order to increase revenue received via various internet sources as one method, and

WHEREAS, the above policy has proven to be a success for the Information Systems & Technology Department, and

WHEREAS, it may be advantageous for other City of La Crosse departments to take advantage of alternative methods of liquidation (sell) surplus, old, retired, and discarded equipment, including trade-in equipment, other than the bi-yearly city auction or listing it as traded-in capital equipment, and

WHEREAS, such properly used liquidation (sell) methods, as listed above, could produce funding to help offset future needed Capital Equipment procurement funding.

NOW BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance or designee and affected Department Head can determine if above method of liquidation (sell) would be advantageous, and increase revenue, and act on it.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED for general fund departments, that proceeds from the sale of surplus, old, retired, discarded, and trade-in equipment via alternate method of liquidation (sell) be deposited in the respective department's Capital Equipment fund account, to offset future Capital Equipment purchases.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED for departments outside of the general fund, that proceeds from the sale of surplus, old, retired, discarded, and trade-in equipment via alternate method of liquidation (sell) be deposited in their respective accounts for their use.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the procurement of future Capital Equipment purchases need to follow the City's Purchasing Policy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to take any and all steps necessary to effectuate this resolution.
