RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the current method for billing sanitary sewer charges to residential customers provides for a credit during two summer quarters based on the lesser amount comparing actual water use or a winter average value.

WHEREAS because of the installed metering arrangement in certain types of non-residential properties, the summer credit is currently applied to these properties.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of La Crosse that the Sanitary Sewer Utility is authorized to revise the billing method for properties that do not meet criteria for designation as residential property.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for purposes of sanitary sewer charges, the criteria for designation as a residential property shall mean any property developed exclusively for residential purposes with three or fewer residential housing units.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for residential properties with separatelymetered irrigation systems, the sewer credit for summer quarters will not apply to other metered water use.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Public Works is hereby authorized to consider and determine the residential or non-residential status of any other property, as related to application of sewer charges.
