

**FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR SEWER CONVEYANCE,
TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL
CITY OF LA CROSSE – SANITARY DISTRICT #2 – TOWN OF SHELBY**

This Fourth Amendment to Agreement for Sewer Conveyance, Treatment and Disposal is entered into between the City of La Crosse, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as 'LA CROSSE,' and the Sanitary Sewer District Number 2 of the Town of Shelby, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, legally organized and incorporated on August 15, 1955, hereinafter referred to as 'SANITARY DISTRICT' and the Town of Shelby, La Crosse County, Wisconsin, hereinafter referred to as "TOWN."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, La Crosse, Sanitary District and Town entered into an Agreement for Sewer conveyance, Treatment and Disposal dated December 21, 2004, for a period of ten (10) years commencing on January 1, 2005, and ending December 31, 2014, and

WHEREAS, the parties approved a First Amendment on July 13, 2017, which expires on December 31, 2018, and

WHEREAS, the parties approved a Second Amendment on December 13, 2018, which expired on June 30, 2019, and

WHEREAS, the parties approved a Third Amendment on July 11, 2019, which expire on December 31, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, LA CROSSE, SANITARY DISTRICT and TOWN hereby amend the agreement as follows:

1. Section 3 is hereby amended to read:
 3. Subject to the terms of this agreement, LA CROSSE shall convey, treat and dispose of sewage for the SANITARY DISTRICT for a period commencing on January 1, 2005 and terminating on March 1, 2020.
2. Except as amended hereby, the Agreement for Sewer Conveyance, Treatment and Disposal dated December 21, 2004 shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
