Re: 2018 CDBG/HOME Allocation Guidelines and Funded Priorities

I. PRE-APPLICATION

All non-profit or non-City applications may only apply for funding if <u>CDBG Administrator</u> approves preapplication question responses. CDBG Administrator will approve of applicant's ability to apply for funds based on the following criteria:

- 1. Independently audited ever year
- 2. CDBG funds and Grant to be kept in a segregated account
- 3. Board of Directors that exercises fiscal and programmatic oversight
- 4. Conflict of interest statement
- 5. Drug-free workplace policy/non-discrimination in service policy
- 6. Written policies and procedures for their program
- 7. Staff paid with CDBG funds complete hourly timesheets and approved by a supervisor
- 8. Adopted procurement procedures (if CDBG funds will be used for items other than salaries)
- 9. Maintain individual case files with documentation of eligibility for beneficiaries

II. EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS

- There will be no public service applications reviewed this year. All were approved for a 2-year funding cycle last year.
- Applications will be ranked based on Committee and Administrative scores, once all funds have been allocated, the bottom tiered applications will not receive funding. If applications receive a cut in costs, the Committee shall identify what cuts in terms of level of service delivery can be expected.
- Only applications that meet one of the stated goals below will be accepted.

III. Funding levels and priorities. (Contingent on final Congressional Approval)

Applications accepted for goals listed below.

2018-2019 FUNDING LEVELS

Neighborhood Revitalization

- 1. Demolish dilapidated housing structures and replace with new, affordable housing.
- 2. Repair aging housing infrastructure (Housing Rehabilitation) ****
- 3. Improve livability, attractiveness, and safety through public infrastructure in target neighborhoods (Lower Northside, PPH, Washburn, and Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Areas).

High Priority: Storm water captured through green infrastructure

High Priority: Street lighting for target neighborhoods (Lower Northside, Corridors, Washburn, PPH) Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Areas).

Affordable Housing

4. Increase mixed-income or mixed-use, affordable rental housing for low-income families, minorities, and persons with disabilities.***

High Priority: Permanent, supportive housing for the homeless This funding would be available only as a loan.

Economic Development

- 5. Increase economic opportunities for low- and moderate-income persons.
- 6. Support neighborhood-based businesses ***

Total Available: \$380,000

Anti-Poverty Services

- 7. Prevent and end homelessness in La Crosse.
- 8. Alleviate poverty and increase self-reliance

\$172,000 Already Committed for Public Service

- *** Funded, through Revolving Loan, Not accepting new applicants
- *** Funded through City SBDL Loan Program, Not accepting new applicants
- *** \$210,000 to be funded through re-allocation of revolving loan funds

- 1. Projects that have never been funded before.
- 2. High priority projects as identified in the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan.
 - B. **Public infrastructure:** lighting, storm water management, facility for the consolidation of several different types of non-profit services, neighborhood plan implementation
 - C. **Housing:** in-fill single family, housing for homeless, code enforcement, affordable rental housing
 - D. Economic Development: small business loans, infrastructure, commercial rehabilitation

V. Multi-Family Low-Income Housing Tax Credit Funding

City staff will release this call for proposals in summer/fall of 2017 again to pursue another Low-Income Tax Credit Project for La Crosse. This will be pending availability of revolving loan funds in Housing Rehabilitation and Small Business Development.
