This is a letter of objection to the Conditional Use Permit for 3120 Farnam Street.

When considering a permit, the long term vision must be contemplated for the property and the community encompassing the City of LaCrosse.

Critical assessment of the following issues are presented for consideration.

Will this impact the future tax base?

If a loss of tax base for this property, what result will specifically affect neighboring properties and La Crosse community?

What loss can directly be imposed on school district and road improvement? Our schools and education system cannot sustain another loss, since tax cuts of 2012 given by State of Wisconsin leadership.

The school systems are the core of our community. When, considering a home to purchase, schools are among the leading criteria.

The local roads, which have been in the forefront, are in critical need of improvement dependent on city and county tax funding.
