A CHARTER ORDINANCE to create Section 19 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of La Crosse regarding term length of the Municipal Court Judge.

WHEREAS Wisconsin Statute §755.01 allows a municipality to create a municipal court and the City of La Crosse has chosen to have a municipal court, and

WHEREAS Wisconsin Statute §755.02 allows a municipality to choose the term length of the Municipal Court Judge.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of La Crosse do ordain as follows:

SECTION I: Section 19 is hereby created to read as follows:

Sec. 19. – Municipal Judge; Term Length

The Municipal Judge shall be elected at large in the spring election in even-numbered years for a term of two years commencing on May 1 succeeding the election.

SECTION II: Any charter provision or any previously enacted ordinance or charter ordinance inconsistent or in conflict herewith is hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION III: This Charter Ordinance shall take effect and be in force sixty (60) days after passage and publication unless within said period a referendum petition shall be filed as provided in Section 66.0101 of the Wisconsin Statutes in which event this ordinance shall not take effect until submission to a referendum vote and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.







I am objecting to the special assessment that has been applied to my properties at 1623 Moore street & 1617 Moore street. The letter that I received on December 20th, 2025 indicates that the City of La Crosse "intends to exercise its police power in accordance with Sec. 38-1 of the Code of Ordinances" that are present for La Crosse. This letter also indicates that these properties benefited from the curb and gutter installation. While this maybe true in regards to rain water runoff it is also true that no one property owner asked for the street to be improved. I grew up on the 1600 block of Moore street and know that curb and gutter has never been present. However, since July 14th, 2011, the City of La Crosse has charged the properties at 1623 & 1617 Moore street for stormwater runoff on a quarterly basis (15⁺ years) over →

At no point in time did the City of La Crosse offer my mother, who owned the property prior, or myself a waiver to this fee. Prior to the recent installation of the curb and gutter most rain water runoff came down into the driveway of 1623 Moore street flooding it and often washing away the driveways leading down towards the garage. Repairs to the driveway were always completed by us. I bring this up because I believe some compensation is owed regarding being charged for storm water runoff for 13½ years when this portion of the street had no curb and no gutters.

The letter received on December 22nd, 2025 appears to be the type of letter that was supposed to be sent to property owners prior to the beginning of the project or at the very least near the beginning (once project started) to alert home owners that there would be a special assessment due to the installatⁿ

of the curb and gutters. The letter also indicates that the estimates would be available "after construction is completed". The street project of the 1600 block of Moore street was completed in November 2024 nearly 13 months prior to receiving the special assessment letter in December 2025.

Additionally, prior to the beginning of the Street project we were sent a description of what was involved and when it would start. There was mention of sidewalks as well which the property owners had an opportunity to voice concerns & opinions. There was no ability to voice concerns or opinions about the installation of curb and gutter. If there had been a meeting to this subject we might have been able to find out about the special assessments at a time prior to the project starting.

Lastly, as the project began, several property owners voiced concerns about the new street with curb & gutter &

sidewalks, and how this might cost the property owners money. At that time we were told by our alderwoman the the cost of the project was to be taken care of by grants and other funding that was available. The onsite city engineer conveyed agreement with this message from our alderwoman.

Points of objection to special assessment

- 1) Lack of transparency and misleading information of future cost.
- 2) Timeliness of notice & distribution of special assessment letter
- 3) Lack of ability to have open discussion regarding placement of curb & gutter on 1600 Moore st.

WHEREAS, such prayer before deliberative public bodies has been consistently upheld as constitutional by American courts, including the United States Supreme Court; and

1. In order to solemnize proceedings of the Council, it is the policy of the Council to allow for an invocation or prayer to be offered at its monthly regular meetings of the Council for the benefit of the Council.

2. The invocation and pledge of allegiance shall ~~not~~ be listed or recognized on the agenda.

3. No member or employee of the Council or any other person in attendance at the meeting shall be required to participate in any prayer that is offered.

4. The prayer or invocation shall be voluntarily delivered by an eligible member of the clergy in the City of La Crosse. To ensure that such person (the "invocation speaker") is selected from among a wide pool of the City's clergy, on a rotating basis, the invocation speaker shall be selected according to the following procedure:

a. The City Clerk shall compile and maintain a database (the "Congregations List") of the religious congregations with an established presence in the local community of La Crosse.

b. The Congregations List shall be compiled by referencing the listing for "churches," "congregations," or other religious assemblies in the annual Yellow Pages phone book(s) published for the City of La Crosse, research from the Internet, and consultation with local chambers of commerce. All religious congregations with an established presence in the local community of La Crosse are eligible to be included in the Congregations List. Any such congregation not otherwise identified for participation may request its inclusion by specific written communication to the City Clerk.

c. This policy is intended to be and shall be applied in a way that is all-inclusive of every diverse religious congregation in the local community of La Crosse. The Congregations List is compiled and used for purposes of logistics, efficiency and equal opportunity for all of the community's religious leaders, who may themselves choose whether to respond to the City Clerk's invitation and participate. Should a question arise as to the authenticity of a religious congregation, the City Clerk shall refer to criteria used by the Internal Revenue Service in its determination of those religious organizations that would legitimately qualify for Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status.

d. The Congregations List shall also include the name and contact information of any chaplain who may serve one or more of the fire departments or law enforcement agencies of the local community of La Crosse.

e. The Congregations List shall be updated, by reasonable efforts of the City Clerk, in November of each calendar year.

f. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this policy, and on or about December 1 of each calendar year thereafter, the City Clerk shall mail an invitation addressed to the "religious leader" of each congregation listed on the Congregations List, as well as to the individual chaplains included on the Congregations List.

g. The invitation shall be dated at the top of the page, signed by the City Clerk or designee at the bottom of the page, and read as follows:

Dear religious leader,

The City of La Crosse Common Council makes it a policy to invite members of the clergy in the local community of La Crosse to voluntarily offer an invocation at the beginning of its meetings, for the benefit and blessing of the Council. As the leader of one of the religious congregations with an established presence in the local community, or in your capacity as a chaplain for one of the local fire departments or law enforcement agencies, you are eligible to offer this service at an upcoming meeting of the Council.

If you are willing to assist the Council in this regard, please send a written reply at your earliest convenience to the City Clerk at the address included on this letterhead. Clergy are scheduled on a first-come, first-serve basis. The dates of the Council's scheduled meetings for the upcoming year are listed on the following, attached page. If you have a preference among the dates, please state that request in your written reply.

This opportunity is voluntary, and you are free to offer the invocation according to the dictates of your own conscience. To maintain a spirit of respect and ecumenism, the Council requests only that the prayer opportunity not be exploited as an effort to convert others to the particular faith of the invocation speaker, nor to disparage any faith or belief different than that of the invocation speaker.

On behalf of the City of La Crosse Common Council, I thank you in advance for considering this invitation.

h. As the invitation letter indicates, the respondents to the invitation shall be scheduled on a first-come, first-serve basis to deliver the invocations.

5. No invocation speaker shall receive compensation for his or her service.

6. The City Clerk shall make every reasonable effort to ensure that a variety of eligible invocation speakers are scheduled for the monthly regular Council meetings. In any event, no invocation speaker shall be scheduled to offer a prayer at consecutive monthly regular meetings of the Council, or at more than two (2) such Council meetings in any calendar year.

7. Neither the Council nor the City Clerk shall engage in any prior inquiry, review of, or involvement in, the content of any prayer to be offered by an invocation speaker.

8. At the opening of the meeting and the agenda/business of the public, the presiding officer of the Council shall introduce the person selected to recite the Pledge of Allegiance, if any, and the invocation speaker to follow the Pledge of Allegiance, and invite only those persons that wish to participate to stand for those observances of and for the Council.

9. This policy is not intended, and shall not be implemented or construed in any way, to affiliate the Council with, nor express the Council's preference for or against, any faith or religious denomination. Rather, this policy is intended to acknowledge and express the Council's respect for the diversity of religious denominations and faiths represented and practiced among the citizens of La Crosse.

10. To clarify the Council's intentions, as stated herein above, the following disclaimer shall be included in at least 10 point font at the bottom of any printed Council meeting agenda: "Any invocation that may be offered at the Council meeting shall be the voluntary offering of a private citizen, to and for the benefit of the Council. The views or beliefs expressed by the invocation speaker have not been previously reviewed or approved by the Council, and the Council will not endorse the religious beliefs or views of this, or any other speaker."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall supersede any prior resolutions of the Council on this subject matter, including without limitation, the Resolution Adopting a Chaplain for all Council Meetings dated 2/14/74 and 5/8/75 as well as Resolution #41841 adopted 5/12/83.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED City staff are authorized to take any and all action necessary to effectuate this Resolution.

I'll be brief in my thoughts and encouragement to you.

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Dear City Council members:

I believe I have special standing to address this issue. Back around the 1990s, I was invited by my friend John Medinger to stand for an open seat on the city council. During the interview, a council member asked me, "Don't you think you're unqualified for the position because you have a master's degree in theology?" If I had had my wits about me, I would have replied, "Are you aware that Article Six of the US Constitution states, "...no religious test shall ever be required as a qualification to any office or public trust under the United States." I believe I was a victim of discrimination at the hands of this body.

The City Council deals with many issues affected by faith--or absence of faith. Among them are:

1. Accountability. If humans are merely the result of a random, purposeless process, the default ethic would be the "law of the jungle." We could be ruled by plutocrats (the richest), technocrats (the most clever), or autocrats (the most arrogantly powerful). My Christian belief system values liberty, yet acknowledges the law of cause and effect and the prospect of ultimate accountability.
2. Discomfort. One council member has been quoted as saying that "...some members of the public expressed discomfort with the prayer during city council meetings." Discomfort comes with maturation and growth. The following quotation from Thomas Jefferson is inscribed on the Northwest Wall of the Jefferson Memorial in Washington, DC: "God who gave us life gave us liberty. Can the liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed a conviction that these liberties are the gift of God? Indeed I tremble for my country when I reflect that God is just, that his justice cannot sleep forever...."
3. History. Prominent history writer Tom Holland's *Dominion: How the Christian revolution remade the world* has been summarized in part by one reviewer as saying that the "foundational teachings [of Christian doctrine] on human equality, ethics, and the individual's value have shaped our modern societal norms and legal systems."

Our country and city could be ruled by a worldview that would dictate and enforce every action of the public. They could abdicate authority to predatory gangs, destructive philosophies, or tyrannical rulers, or they could accept their high calling and ask a Higher Power--if you will the Grand Designer of Stephen Hawking's "Grand Design," the Judge of all the Earth, and perhaps the Good Shepherd, the Suffering Servant, the Prince of Peace, for wisdom in deliberations and decisions.



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Dear La Crosse City Council Members,

I spoke at J&A on Jan. 7, 2026 in favor of ending invocations at City Hall. I let an old hurt in La Crosse I felt 30 years ago, but still fresh to me, drive some of my emotion: a spray-painted swastika on a footbridge in Myrick Park that was apparently ignored by city staff and everyone else, as no one thought to call it in to remove it for about a year until I noticed it was still there.

I want to be a little more personal here and give you a clearer sense of what it feels like to be a person not in the majority in a “captured” audience in order to petition my civic government or have my civic governmental affairs decided. It is a sense of alienation and exclusion. It is a feeling of intrusiveness, with a more dominant religion explaining to me. It is the feeling that I am not protected as a minority member even despite American principles that the minority should be protected against the inherent power of the majority. It is something I cannot just “ignore” if I don’t feel “comfortable with it. It is not ignorable, if I am present in Chambers. I object to being made invisible

I hear this discomfort from other people in La Crosse in minority religions, those who do not have a formal religion, or are part of a faith tradition that simply keeps to itself rather than appear publicly to instruct and lecture on wisdom and offer blessings. This can be for any number of private and valid policy reasons of their own. I know very well from personal experience what it feels like to be public on some issues and to be targeted for expressing my opinion. Usually in fact I say a prayer to myself before I go to the podium – but that’s my choice.

In my faith tradition, we do a beautiful prayer for the government each week from our prayer book. But it isn’t part of our local tradition or policy to stand in city hall to pray directly to its elected officials.

I know that Congress and other legislative bodies may begin with prayer. Courts including the U.S. Supreme Court in many instances allow prayer. But please consider that here on our local level, where we know our people, our neighbors, we try to broadly extend ourselves to make everyone feels included and wanted. We actually have the ability to do that, and it is even in our policy

interests to do so. We want to protect their freedom of religion and of speech, by not bringing into our civic, governmental building that which they may not have a choice about.

I wouldn't dream of being disrespectful by not standing up when prayer is offered.

I also have little doubt that I would be singled out for it.

Allowing "an opportunity" to bring in clergy is hollow. I don't believe the city should be keeping "a data base" on the "authenticity" of a religious organization, and be able to scrutinize it to see if it would "legitimately qualify for Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status." I am shocked that the 2009 resolution and Policy and Procedure in 7-9-09 for opening invocations even has that in it. It is not the City's right to essentially judge the worth of another's religious group. It is not right to require "an established presence in the community" before being granted this license. This is not the government's business. It does not serve any policy. It is exclusionary rather than inclusive. It is an unwelcome and excessive interference.

That virtually no faith leaders come to City Council other than Christian clergy clearly shows the failure of the 2009 resolution.

I write to you as a citizen very involved in faith activity under government authority. I served on the La Crosse Jail Ministry Board for over 10 years, including several as President. The difference is that the inmates request to interact with the chaplain, and the chaplain is prepared to help any inmate of any faith, creed, or belief system – without testing its validity.

Exchange of ideas and cooperation, and active fellowship with members of many faith communities in La Crosse has been something I've loved and appreciated most about La Crosse – I deeply value the Iverson Freking Ecumenical Recognition I received in 2017 from Bethany St. Joseph and the Christian Communities of the greater La Crosse area.

Those are spaces I choose to engage in.

Invocation at city hall is not simply old fashioned -- it flies in the face of where we are going in diverse, multicultural, multi-religion La Crosse. Almost all of the many public community events I attend as an active citizen give heartfelt, universal spiritual invocations that do not directly tie to one religion. If they are religious prayers – well, I've usually chosen to be there, and I respect them.

Acts of antisemitism have not disappeared in La Crosse since I saw that swastika in Myrick Park in 1995. Remember too, that La Crosse was once a Sundown City where Black people had virtually no respected space. Remember the local anti-Muslim activity in recent years.

Finally, I ask the question, what governmental purpose is served with prayer to the clergy? How does it fit in with what City Hall must accomplish? Can we make decisions about taxes, the homeless,

liquor licenses, snow removal, etc. without divine intervention directed to our council members for their “benefit and blessings?” What do we gain by keeping it, other than more divisiveness? I believe our conscientious, duly elected city council members, who by and large come from strong faith backgrounds, can rely on their deep, personal value systems to continue their responsibilities and their fine work for us.

The La Crosse County Board eliminated prayer around 20 years ago after debate because of its divisiveness, and we are doing just fine without prayer given to us. (Still the 4th lowest county property tax rate per person in Wisconsin, we’ll often tell ya.)

We’ve gotten so much more aware through the years.

Please, appreciate the full effects on others, on everyone, of prayers at government meetings. Please know how invocations make people feel unwelcome, even though this may be unintentional.

As a wise person willing to listen with their heart and intellect once acknowledged to me, “(Some) may be able to just move through the system with blind spots to other people’s discomfort, but others cannot.”

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Dear City Council Members,

Yesterday I had the opportunity to share my opinion regarding the meeting invocations at City Council meetings and the resolution to end them at the J&A meeting. The following is essentially what I had to say yesterday.

For those of you who do not know me, I am a retired Ophthalmologist who practiced at Mayo Clinic Health System in La Crosse for 26 years and fully retired in 2024.

Thank you in advance for considering my thoughts as you decide the future of invocations.

"I would like to speak in support of the resolution to end the practice of prayer in conjunction with meetings of the City Council.

Personally I fully embrace prayer but that is a personal matter between me and my creator. I do not believe that it is the role of any governmental body to offer a 'rotating clergy' that does not represent faiths that either choose not to participate nor does it represent faiths too small to operate 'congregations' nor does it represent those without faith of any organized religion.

A recent Pew research poll (January, 2024) reported that 28% of Americans are religiously unaffiliated describing themselves as "atheists, agnostics or 'nothing in particular' when asked about their religion. And this is a growing portion of Americans.

Perhaps you think that these Americans are 'wrong'. That a little prayer would be good for them. But that is their business and it is not the role of government to determine which religious faith is 'right' or whether religion is correct at all. This is a private matter in our country.

Furthermore, this avoidance of prayer protects the religious faiths in our community as well.

Do you realize that "religious leaders" must agree, as it says in the third paragraph of the invitation,

"This opportunity is voluntary, and you are free to offer the invocation according to the dictates of your own conscience. To maintain a spirit of respect and ecumenism, the Council requests only that the prayer opportunity not be exploited as an effort to convert others to the particular

faith of the invocation speaker, nor to disparage any faith or belief different than that of the invocation speaker.”

Personally I agree with this sensibility.

But if you are honest about it, you also will see that this requires a ‘watering down’ perhaps of a clergy member’s own beliefs.

This is the effect of government interference with religious practice just in that paragraph.

Religious freedom demands that each individual in America be respected on an equal basis to their own beliefs and practices. That is a good thing.

Mixing the two as this practice allows, fails to equally represent all beliefs or lack thereof and dictates to clergy HOW and WHAT they should say.

I reject this.

In this time of great division, let us not continue a practice that makes some individuals feel better or respected and others to feel left out or disrespected.

Thank you for this time."

I understand that this might be a difficult decision for all of you to make. While it might appear that the Council by removing these clergy-led invocations is taking a stand against religion and thus religious freedom, it is actually quite the opposite. By removing religious invocations, you are respecting every single member of our community at every meeting regardless of their religious faith or lack thereof. By not dictating to clergy members the content and form of their prayers you are also protecting the right of religious faiths to pray without governmental regulation.

Dear Council Members:

La Crosse and area communities have a long standing tradition of saying prayers before many meetings. I strongly disapprove of your wanting to stop the practice of prayer before the City or County meetings. Let's take a look at why I see this attempt as a non-starter:

In La Crosse there are between 100-150 churches. That indicates the community is largely religious.

Again, pointing to the conclusion that the community is largely religious, there are around 13 private schools in the city, with a significant portion (62%) being religiously affiliated.

In La Crosse, church membership, using 2020 data, reflects over 20,000 Catholics, over 10,000 ELCA Lutherans, almost 8,000 WI Synod Lutherans and smaller members for other Protestant groups.

These numbers reflect a clear majority (62%) of people in La Crosse who belong to organized religions and who most likely pray. 38% do not affiliate with any specific religion, although they may well indeed, pray.

The La Crosse City Council is composed of roughly 8 people, that are supposedly representing roughly 52,680 community members. As I stated above, 62% of the people are church affiliated, which means they most likely pray or believe in prayer, yet the City Council is indicating that the larger group doesn't want to support prayer before a meeting where their interests are being represented. The Council's logic/decision does not fit the people's narrative. From my viewpoint, the people are not being represented and they are not being heard or are being ignored.

The Council needs to leave the tradition of prayer in place and instead, focus on the real issues the City/County have in front of them. This is clearly a majority rule...the Community knows what it takes to represent them. The Community has spoken...now REPRESENT the Community, and set your personal biases aside.

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is advancing the Highway 53 Corridor Study within the jurisdiction of the City of La Crosse, from King Street to La Crosse Street; and

WHEREAS, the corridor affected by the Highway 53 Corridor Study serves local businesses, residents, and visitors, and on-street parking is an important component of access, economic vitality, and neighborhood livability; and

I am writing to express my support for the resolution requesting WisDOT to develop and evaluate additional design alternatives for the Highway 53 Corridor Study.

I think there is a shared understanding that this is a big project, an important one, and one we want to get right. I love our downtown and I want what is best for it long term. I view the addition of protected bicycle facilities as a boost to downtown. This approach has been studied and implemented in other communities, where it has often contributed positively to safety, access, and economic activity.

At the same time, I also advocate for thoughtful and sound practices around parking, including recognizing its true environmental, social and fiscal costs and right sizing it. These conversations are not simple, and I appreciate that many people are sincerely trying to find balance and can see the nuance in it.

Because of that, I support this resolution as written. I have encouraged compromise in this discussion. Early on I was interested in Alternative 2A, and I have even sketched out my own ideas for how this corridor could better balance competing needs. What this resolution does, in my view, is create space for WisDOT to dig deeper and see whether there is another solution that better balances the competing desires for parking, safety, access, and long term goals for the corridor.

At best, this process yields a compromise alternative that meaningfully responds to the concerns raised by different stakeholders. At worst, it confirms that the current options are the best available. Either way, that information is valuable, and it comes at no cost to the City.

I see no downside to asking WisDOT to explore whether something better is out there. If there is, that would be a win for the community. For that reason, I encourage you to vote in favor of the resolution.

Thank you for your time and for your work on this important issue.

THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of La Crosse does ordain as follows:

SECTION I: Section 10-393 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 10-393. - Definitions.

Community stand means a small cabinet or structure for distributing free food and other essential items.

Community fridge means a refrigerator for distributing free food items.

Community pantry means a more general term that refers to a publicly accessible community fridge or a community stand that allows community members to share food freely, reducing waste and addressing food insecurity.

SECTION II: Section 10-394 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 10-394. - Exemptions.

The provisions of this article shall not apply to the following:

(10) A community pantry located on private property with the following provisions:

- a. Notification to the La Crosse County Health Department and compliance with health codes.
- b. Provide a safe and sanitary structure to house the community pantry and protect it from the weather and animals.
- c. Compliance with any permit and zoning requirements for accessory structures.
- d. Provide an approved and permitted source of electrical connection; no extension cords unless on a temporary basis.
- e. Provide daily monitoring and cleaning of the property and surrounding area.
- f. Provide signage to identify the program and contact information.

SECTION III: Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this division shall not be affected.

Follow-Up Information

Tequila's

Synopsis:

Tequila's met with the La Crosse Police Department and the City Attorney's Office and agreed to an abatement plan. This abatement plan went into effect October 1st.

The components of the abatement plan included the following requirements:

- Check ID of those who appear 30 years of age or younger.
- Verification of two forms of identification for entry
- Immediate contact with law enforcement regarding suspicious activity
- Submission of a monthly customer log

Follow-Up Actions:

- 25-44736 – *Trouble with Party:* On October 1st, Tequila's employees contacted law enforcement to report suspected underage individuals attempting to gain entry. Three underage individuals (ages 17–20) were issued citations for possession of false identification.
- 25-50173 – *Bar Check:* On November 4th, officers conducted a bar check and found no violations.
- 25-54331 – *Bar Check:* On December 4th, officers conducted a bar check in partnership with the Department of Revenue – Division of Alcohol Beverages. Several violations were identified. Education was provided regarding the violations; no enforcement action was taken.

Miscellaneous:

Tequila's did not submit customer logs which was agreed upon for their abatement plan for the months of October, November, and December until requested by law enforcement. When asked why they stated they did not have copies of the log which was furnished to them at the abatement meeting. Copies were provided and reports were submitted late.

Compliance Checks

During this quarter, the La Crosse Police Department continued promoting responsible alcohol sales, purchases, and consumption within the community. Recognizing the impact alcohol-related issues have on public safety, the department prioritized education,

enforcement, and community engagement. In partnership with the Department of Revenue – Division of Alcohol Beverages, compliance checks were conducted at both Class A and Class B licensed establishments.

- **Total Compliance Checks:** 33 (October 1st – December 31st)
- **Failures:** Each establishment had one or more failures; most were addressed through education and corrective guidance.

Notable Violations:

- Cheap Andy's: No licensed bartender or agent was present at the time of inspection. A citation was issued for failure to have a licensed bartender (Ordinance 4-110).
- Citgo – State Road: Multiple violations were identified. While some items located were legal, they raised significant concerns:
 - Sale of glass pipes
 - Sale of Nitrous Oxide containers (“whippets”) in multiple sizes
 - Sale of mushroom products, THC Delta-8, and THC-A products
- **Total Bar Checks:** 88 bar checks conducted between October 1st and December 31st.

Education and Outreach

- **Alcohol Compliance Training:** Four officers received training through the Department of Revenue – Division of Alcohol Beverages to assist with future compliance checks in 2026.

Enforcement

Comparative Analysis:

- Enforcement activity increased compared to the same quarter of the previous license year.
- **Bar Checks:**
 - 2024: 73
 - 2025: 88
 - Approximate 20% increase year to year (includes compliance checks)

Citations Issued: 23

Observations:

Enforcement actions involving licensed establishments continue to increase, with a sustained focus on compliance, education, and corrective measures.

Concerning Establishment

Citgo

Over the past year, the La Crosse Police Department has received Crime Stoppers tips indicating that underage individuals know Citgo as a known location for purchasing alcohol and other concerning items. In September, Citgo failed a compliance check after selling alcohol to a minor and was cited for Ordinance 4-6.

During the most recent compliance check, Citgo was also found to be in violation of invoice maintenance requirements and was educated on proper record-keeping practices. In addition, several concerning items were located within the establishment.

Legal Items (Concerning):

- Numerous glass pipes. While legal to possess, these items are commonly used by individuals to consume illegal substances.
- Several large (2KG) “Exotic Whip” Nitrous Oxide containers, along with thousands of single-use flavored Nitrous Oxide containers. These items are commonly referred to as “whippets” and are frequently used to “huff” in order to experience a psychoactive effect.
- A variety of mushroom products and THC Delta-8 or THC-A products. These items are currently legal and synthetically produced to provide effects similar to illegal substances, such as THC Delta-9.

Illegal Items:

- 175 Malegra 200mg tablets (Sildenafil/generic Viagra), a prescription-only medication in the United States. These tablets were located beneath the counter, seized by officers, and the cashier admitted they were being sold for \$7 per tablet. A report was completed and forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for review.

Follow-Up Actions:

- After speaking with the District Attorney further investigation will be conducted to determine if the owner of Citgo knowingly knew the prescription was only available by prescription to determine if criminal charges will be filed.
- Provide formal written notice to the license holder documenting identified violations, compliance concerns, and expectations for corrective action.
- Coordinate with the Cigarette, Tobacco, and Vape Agent and the appropriate licensing agent to review potential violations and assess the sale of legal but high-risk items.
- Conduct additional compliance checks during the next quarter to monitor corrective actions and ongoing compliance.
- On going communication with the City Attorney's and City Clerk's Offices.

Summary

Throughout this reporting period, the La Crosse Police Department continued to carry out alcohol compliance and enforcement initiatives in furtherance of public safety and regulatory accountability. Through increased inspections, targeted enforcement actions, and coordination with our state partners, compliance concerns were identified and addressed, and establishments requiring continued oversight were documented. These efforts will remain ongoing in the upcoming quarter, with continued emphasis on preventing underage access and mitigating alcohol-related impacts within the community.




