



Re: Latino's Bar

This memorandum was generated due to an overwhelming concern of underage UW-La Crosse students being overserved alcohol at Latino's Bar. UW-La Crosse has zero tolerance for underage alcohol consumption. The UW-La Crosse Police Department takes a proactive response on patrol to mitigate potential issues from underage alcohol consumption.

The UW-La Crosse Police Department strives to provide a safe and proactive learning environment for our students. Officers on patrol, especially during the night shift, have a presence to deter problematic behaviors that can occur due to over consumption of alcohol as an underage person.

The UW-La Crosse Police Department practices behavior-based enforcement. Officers are trained to look for problematic behaviors associated with alcohol consumption by underage persons. Officers on night shift frequently interact with students under the influence of alcohol, who may be a danger to themselves, are incapacitated by alcohol, and are displaying behaviors consistent with intoxication.

Officers on night shift are aware of their surroundings and take a proactive approach to intervene with students who appear to be under the influence of alcohol or incapacitated due to alcohol consumption.

Recently, there has been an increase in our underage students being overserved alcohol at Latino's Bar. Officers observe the following behaviors and perform welfare checks on these students to ensure safety measures are in place:

- Students staggering and having the inability to control their gait
- Students urinating in public
- Students vomiting due to over consumption of alcohol
- Students being carried on campus due to over consumption of alcohol

UW-La Crosse Police Department officers are trained to look for these characteristics and engage in behavior-based enforcement to conduct welfare checks for the safety of our students. During contacts with students who display the above behaviors, it's common during questioning, they admit to over consuming alcohol at Latino's Bar. These students are underage, may have fake identification stating they are 21 years of age to enter the bar, or may gain entrance to Latino's Bar without providing identification.

The UW-La Crosse Police Department has documented incident reports from students who admit to over consuming alcohol at Latino's Bar. During police contact, some students perform preliminary breath tests, and the recorded BrAC (breath alcohol concentration) levels are dangerously high and may result in first responder/ambulance calls for alcohol detoxification.

Specifically, since January 2023, there have been numerous documented cases where underage UW-La Crosse students over consumed alcohol at Latino's Bar and have been transported to local hospitals for alcohol detoxification or have been released to friends (no alcohol in their system) to care for them until they are sober.

Spring semester began at UW-La Crosse on Monday, January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025. On Thursday night, January 30<sup>th</sup>, the UW-La Crosse PD had contact with three underage individuals cited for UAL 1<sup>st</sup> Offense (125.07(4)(b)). The two cases involved them being overserved at Latino's Bar. There were also posts on Yik Yak stating Latino's Bar was raided by police. The case numbers below are from Thursday night contacts by UW-La Crosse PD:

The above UW-La Crosse Police Department incident reports specifically state from UW-La Crosse underage students, or friends who are taking care of these students, that alcohol was consumed at Latino's Bar. UW-La Crosse Police officers observe colored wristbands on these students, which is used at Latino's Bar for drink specials (all you can drink, entrance to the bar, etc.)

The City of La Crosse has a history of underage alcohol incidents. Students have drowned in the Mississippi River due to high levels of intoxication. Students often walk home from downtown to

campus and this is a safety issue due to low lighting, vehicular traffic, and being disoriented and not being aware of their location and how to get home safely.

UW-La Crosse students are observed at residence halls, boarding the Safe Ride Bus, which provides free transportation to the downtown area (specific routes). This bus is utilized as a means for transportation to bars downtown and a safe ride home to the residence halls. The residence halls where these bus stops are located allows for underage students to board the bus for transportation to Latino's Bar and potentially other establishments downtown.

A major area of concern is when students begin walking back to campus, they have to cross streets with high vehicular traffic (West Ave). When students are under the influence of alcohol, or have been overserved alcohol, this lowers their inhibitions and ability to think clearly or cross these busy streets safely.

UW-La Crosse students also utilize Uber for a means of transportation to Latino's Bar or other establishments downtown. When Uber drivers bring students back to campus, often they are dropped off and it is unknown if they can make it to their residence halls safely (#80-24-11493).

Due to the increased presence of the UW-La Crosse Police Department, often these students are intercepted due to our behavior-based enforcement. If it weren't for our increased presence, these students could potentially become victims of crimes (physical altercations, sexual assault, or even death due to alcohol poisoning).

When the UW-La Crosse Police Department has law enforcement contact with intoxicated students, we are able to assess their needs and determine the best course of action, based upon the student's behaviors. The intoxicated student is released to a person willing to care for them, or the student is transported to a local hospital via Tri-State Ambulance for alcohol detoxification.

When students are cited for UAL 125.07(4)(b) (Underage Liquor Law Violation Possession/consumption) by the UW-La Crosse Police Department, they may be entitled to attend our Alcohol Diversion Program, in lieu of attending the mandatory court date assigned to the citation. The UW-La Crosse Police Department Alcohol Diversion Program consists of the following:

- Requires the violator to register for the program within 5 business days of contact with the UW-La Crosse Police Department's officer
- Pay an administrative fee
- Attend a 2-hour At-Risk Alcohol Consumption Class (proctored by a UW-La Crosse PD officer)
- Complete a 2-page impact paper regarding the contact and the consequences of the incident and contact with UW-La Crosse Police
- Requires the violator not to reoffend within 90 days (if the violator offends within 90 days, the first UAL citation and the second require a mandatory court appearance)

It's common when these students complete their impact paper, they discuss the negative consequences related to their decision to consume alcohol. During class they often talk about their experiences at Latino's Bar and the interaction with law enforcement.

Yik Yak, a popular social media app, has numerous posts about consuming alcohol at Latino's Bar (the students refer to Latino's Bar as "Tinos"). Students post about "getting turned up at Tinos" and other tag lines are used, reference the underage alcohol consumption at Latino's Bar. Some UW-La Crosse students refer to Latino's Bar as the "Freshman bar."

I use the Yik Yak app to monitor this behavior and to increase our presence on campus, to ensure our students are returning to their residence halls safely and to ensure our officers are engaging in behavior-based enforcement.

Previously in this memorandum, I mention specific cases pertaining to Latino's Bar. The UW-La Crosse Police Department has numerous underage alcohol contacts. In the cases I listed the officers specifically ask where the student consumed alcohol. The cases listed are not all of our UAL contacts, because there are more where students were overserved alcohol at Latino's Bar, but it was not captured in the officers' reports.

Based upon the contacts made with students, Latino's Bar is the catalyst for problematic behavior. The UW-La Crosse Police Department has concerns about our students being overserved alcohol, underage, at Latino's Bar. This problematic behavior must be brought to the attention of La Crosse city officials before a tragedy occurs. The UW-La Crosse Police Department is diligent in our patrol efforts, but assistance is needed to bring attention to this issue for the safety of our students (and other underage persons). College is supposed to be an exciting time for students to gain their independence and prepare for adulthood. It's sad and tragic when our campus experiences serious crimes against our students or death. Providing alcohol to underage persons is serious and Latino's Bar needs to be held responsible for contributing to this problematic behavior.

Attached to this memorandum are reports generated from the UW-La Crosse Police Department's records management system, false identification cards used by students to enter Latino's Bar, and posts from Yik Yak referencing Latino's Bar. The UW-La Crosse Police Department wants attention brought to this problem for the safety of our students.

### Interview With Alyssa Ferguson:

I met with Alyssa on 02/21/2023 at 1100 hours. I asked Alyssa to tell me about the evening that she was cited and had police contact. Alyssa stated that they started the night at Tequilas, where they shared two pitchers of margaritas. Alyssa told me that she was not carded at Tequilas. Alyssa told me that Lindsey left, and she and Lexi went to Latinos Bar. She stated that she was carded at Latinos. At Latinos Alyssa stated they each had two lemonade vodka drinks. She stated that at no time did she see Lexi leave her drink alone or anyone around them that could have had Lexi's drink. Alyssa stated Latinos was very busy while they were there. She said Lexi got very intoxicated, so she called an Uber and returned back to campus where they had police contact. She stated that she was assisting Lexi with walking when they fell. When asked why she called Lexi by her sister's name, she stated she did not know and tried to say she was confused. Alyssa stated that she just went along with it.

Due to Alyssa's actions that evening I pulled her UW-L's alcohol diversion program and told Alyssa that she will have to attend her court hearing. She understood and she left the interview room.

### Officer Observation

On the above date and time, I drove on the Badger St Mall and observed two females walking towards the 15th St Mall. The females were staggering and fell onto the ground. Based on this behavior I made contact with the females to check their welfare.

### Officer Action

I told the females to stop and they complied. As I spoke to the females, Lindsey J Szymanski, who was verbally identified and her identity was confirmed through Cbord had difficulty maintaining her balance. I asked Szymanski how much she had to drink and she replied, "One margarita." She continued to say "I had one margarita at Tequilas." The other female was identified by a valid WI DL as Alyssa G. Ferguson. Szymanski and Ferguson had a strong odor of an intoxicant emitting from their person and their eyes were bloodshot and glossy. Szymanski could not find her identification and kept repeating herself.

Officer Lor arrived at my location to assist. Officer Lor asked Szymanski and Ferguson to perform PBT's and they complied. Szymanski was unable to provide an adequate breath sample, but admitted to consuming one margarita. Ferguson performed a PBT and her BrAC level was .16. Officer Lor asked Szymanski basic welfare questions but she was unable to provide correct answers, kept repeating herself, and had difficulty maintaining her balance.

Due to Szymanski's inability to answer basic welfare questions and her intoxication level, Tri-State was called to assess Szymanski. Tri-State arrived on scene and conducted a brief assessment with Szymanski and determined detox was not needed. Szymanski told Tri-State personnel she was "very drunk."

### Disposition

Ferguson stated she is staying with Szymanski for the night. Szymanski lives in Wentz Hall. Officer Lor escorted Ferguson and Szymanski to Wentz Hall to make sure they gained access to the residence hall.

Ferguson and Szymanski were cited for UAL 1st Offense and offered the UW-La Crosse Police Department Alcohol Diversion Program. The citations and program were explained and they stated they understood. Ferguson and Szymanski received copies of their citations and diversion paperwork.

Alexis stated that she received a citation; however, it was in her twin sister's name Lindsey. Officer Pehl gave Alexis Sgt. Miller's business card and told her to contact her as he was unfamiliar with the incident.

## Sgt. Miller:

I spoke with Sgt. Miller and she asked me to follow up on this incident.

## BWC Video:

I watched Sgt. Miller's and Officer Lor's body-worn camera (BWC) video. In those videos, Alexis verbally identified herself as Lindsey by verbally saying Lindsey's full name and date of birth. She stated numerous different times that her name was Lindsey to both Officer Lor and Sgt. Miller. Alyssa Ferguson who was also cited called Alexis, Lindsey numerous times. When the officers and/or the EMS personnel spoke to Alexis she would always answer to Lindsey.

Alexis had numerous opportunities to correct the mistake and failed to do so.

## Phone Call:

I called Alexis at 0737 hours on 02/20/2023. This conversation was recorded with my BWC. I identified myself and asked if she could come to our office to speak about the incident. She stated she could come to our office at 1210. I agreed and told her to ask for me when she arrived.

## Interview With Alexis:

At 1200 hours Alexis arrived at the police department to meet with me. I interviewed Alexis in the front interview room, it was recorded on my BWC and also the interview room camera. I introduced myself and Alexis asked to be called Lexi. Lexi was read her Miranda Warnings, she acknowledged that she understood them and she waived her rights by signing the waiver form.

Lexi first started telling me that she does not remember anything from that night and she thinks she was drugged. When asked to start the night from the beginning she stated that Alyssa, Lindsey, and herself started the night at Tequilas. Lexi stated that they shared two pitchers of margaritas. Lexi also informed me that Tequilas did not card her; however, she admitted to having a fake ID. Lexi stated that her sister Lindsey left to go to her boyfriend's place, and she and Alyssa decided to go to the Latino Bar and Grill. Lexi stated that the bouncer at Latino Bar and Grill did check her ID at the door. She remembers walking in and getting a drink. Lexi stated she did not remember anything after that. When I asked further questions she stated they left Latino Bar and Grill and took an Uber back to campus. Shortly after being dropped off, she had contact with the Police. She was upset over the officer not getting her alcohol level and only got Alyssa's. I explained to her that she would not blow into the tube correctly and it appeared she may have gotten spit into the PBT. I said the officer went and got a different PBT to get Alyssa's BrAC. I explained to Lexi that on the bodycam I saw her trying to get Alyssa not to blow into the PBT correctly. I also explained that the officers had Tri-State come to their location to get her cleared by the EMTs. Lexi stated she did not know that she was seen by the EMTs. Lexi did not have any reason why she would give Sgt. Miller her sister's name on numerous different occasions and would continue to answer to that name. She answered Lindsey when the officers, EMTs, and Alyssa used it. I believe that would be very hard to do if it was not done on purpose/intent.

I answered all of Lexi's questions and left her to produce citations.

## Disposition:

I issued citations to Lexi for Underage Alcohol-possession/consumption, Chapter 18 UWS for Obstructing a Police Officer. I answered anymore questions she had and released Lexi.

When I asked further questions she stated they left Latino Bar and Grill and took an Uber back to campus. Shortly after being dropped off, she had contact with the Police. She was upset over the officer not getting her alcohol level and only got Alyssa's. I explained to her that she would not blow into the tube correctly and it appeared she may have gotten spit into the PBT. I said the officer went and got a different PBT to get Alyssa's BrAC. I explained to Lexi that on the bodycam I saw her trying to get Alyssa not to blow into the PBT correctly. I also explained that the officers had Tri-State come to their location to get her cleared by the EMTs. Lexi stated she did not know that she was seen by the EMTs. Lexi did not have any reason why she would give Sgt. Miller her sister's name on numerous different occasions and would continue to answer to that name. She answered Lindsey when the officers, EMTs, and Alyssa used it. I believe that would be very hard to do if it was not done on purpose/intent.

answered all of Lexi's questions and left her to produce citations.

## Disposition:

I issued citations to Lexi for Underage Alcohol-possession/consumption, Chapter 18 UWS for Obstructing a Police Officer. I answered anymore questions she had and released Lexi.

I contacted Merle, who was walking through the NE end of Eagle Hall. Merle lived in and heard loud noises outside his room around 0230 hours (05-12-23). Merle did not see anyone cause the damage.

**Contact with Grant M. Hohman and August L. Richter**

I contacted Hohman and Richter, who were leaving room . Hohman and Richter both told me they were trying to sleep last night because they had a final exam this morning but were kept up by noises coming from outside the room. Richter advised me that his roommate (later identified as Anthony Willey) and his friends were connected to the above damages. Richter advised me that Willey and his friends had been consuming intoxicants last night, and Willey was sleeping in the room. Richter said it was fine to enter the room so I could talk with Willey. Richter woke Willey up verbally. Richter and Hohman left the room at that point, as to take their final exam.

**Contact with Anthony Willey**

contacted Willey and identified myself as Officer Guentz of the UWL Police Department. I observed that Willey had been consuming intoxicants recently by the smell of alcoholic beverages coming from his person (s). Once Willey was awake, I spoke with him about what he knew about the above damages.

At first, Willey denied knowing anything about the above damages. Willey had inconsistent accounts of what he knew about the above damages and how sober or intoxicated he was last night. Oddly, Willey told me that if there were any damages, he was willing to pay for them.

During my time talking with Willey, he acknowledged throwing Animal Crackers at his two buddies (later identified as Zachery Meyer and Exander Rains), but they picked them all up (Note: There were numerous Animal Crackers on the floor throughout the 3rd-floor hallway and the common area near room 315). Willey later acknowledged that he threw a Coke can (Note: There were 2 Coke cans on the 3rd-floor hallway and dark soda on the walls of the 3rd-floor hallway near room 315). Willey admitted to damaging an Exit sign on the 3rd floor.

Willey told me that he was partying with Zachery Meyer, Exander Rains, Katie (Brooks), Abby (Munch), and Ava (Matthai) at another location, Latinos Bar, and in his room ( ) at different times last night (05-11-23) and this morning (05-12-23). Willey told me that Meyer and Rains were more intoxicated than he had been and caused some of the damages that I had observed throughout Eagle Hall. Willey believed that Meyer and Rains must have caused the damages on the upper floors because they live on the 5th floor.

While I spoke with Willey, I observed in plain view two orange colored traffic cones under his bed. One traffic cone had UWL marked on it, and the other had nothing written on it. Willey told me the traffic cones were not related to the above incidents, as they were taken on a different day. Additionally, I observed in plain view a rusty brown heavy metal water sewer cover on the windowsill of Willey's room. Willey told me that Meyer took the sewer item sometime last night (05-11-23) or this morning (05-12-23) but could not remember the location. Willey did not believe the sewer piece was taken from UWL property. I collected the above items and they were later placed into a UWL Police Department evidence locker.

I explained to Willey that I was going to have Detective Meyer talk to him about the above criminal damage incidents and the other items found in his room in further detail. Please see Detective Meyer's supplemental report for further information.

#### **Contact with Brandon Koga (Eagle Hall RA)**

As I was in the Eagle Hall lobby, Koga identified himself as the Eagle Hall RA and had some information related to the above incidents. Koga had contact with the residents of room last night (05-11-23) between 0130-0200 hours, as he was making his RA rounds. Koga did not notice any property damage when he was making his rounds.

Koga contacted Willey in his room because of the noise level. Koga estimated that about 8 people were partying in the room. Koga explained people in the room were disrespectful toward him and tried closing the door on him. Koga believed after he contacted the occupants of the room, they must have left because the noise level went way down.

I was in dispatch at the time of the call and made my way to Drake Hall to assist LCPD. I made two laps around Drake Hall and did not locate anything until 0107, I located three males on the sidewalk walking between Wentz and Hutchinson Hall headed towards Drake Hall.

### Initial Contact:

I stopped the three males and identified myself as UPD and exited my vehicle and activated my BWC (Body Worn Camera). One male (Later identified as Brady Aldrich) stated they were stopped by a couple of city officers and they had "Cleared it up with other officers and we didn't do anything bad." I informed the males they would not be going anywhere until LCPD officers talked to them first. I informed dispatch of our location and asked the males if they climbed buildings downtown. The male in the middle of the group (Later identified as Matthew Ciesielczyk) stated they were by the river walk and later stated they went to see the Rotary Lights.

### Contact with LCPD:

### Initial Observation:

At approximately 0420, I was sitting in the driveway of Eagle Hall when I observed a male walking west bound on the UW-L side of the sidewalk. The male appeared to be staggering and walking in a way that appeared as if he was in a "zombie" like state. I notified dispatch of the check welfare and stepped out with the male.

### Contact with Alex:

Once I was out with the male I activated my BWC (Body Worn Camera) and identified myself as UWLPD, the male continued to walk and ignore me as I talked to him. I ordered the male to stop, he again ignored me and continued to walk away from me. I safely initiated contact with the male, the male stopped and turned towards me and spoke to me in an incoherent manner. I asked him what he said and after repeating himself 3 times he stated "Let me go I'm fine." I told the male I could tell he was not fine due to him having leaves stuck to himself, bloodshot eyes, heavy odor of intoxicants coming from him, staggering as he was walking and his slurred/incoherent speech. I asked the male if he had anything to drink and he stated "Yes." I asked if he had any form of ID (identification) on him and he stated "Yeah" but was unable to locate any ID on his person. The male to verbally identified himself as Alex Bautista (Later ID'd as Alex Bautista Lopez). I also noticed he was missing a shoe for his left foot.

I asked Alex if he had been drinking and he stated "Yeah, Latinos" which is a popular bar in downtown La Crosse. I contacted dispatch to send a LCPD officer to assist me due to Alex being highly intoxicated. Alex stated he had been sleeping in the bushes outside of Laux Hall and when asked stated he resided at Laux Hall (later to find out he actually resides at \_\_\_\_\_). I asked Alex basic welfare questions. I asked Alex what year it is, he stated "2014" when asked what city we are in Alex stated "Onalaska" and when asked to name the river that flows down by La Crosse (the Mississippi River) Alex stated "Onalaska Flow River." I also asked Alex where he lives and he stated "Onalaska." I informed dispatch that Alex was unable to answer basic welfare questions and would talk with the LCPD officer to determine if he needed to be medically evaluated by Tri-State for detox. Alex stated he was fine going to detox.

### LCPD/Tri-State on scene:

LCPD officer Skifton arrived on scene. I informed Officer Skifton what Alex told me and about him not being able to answer basic welfare questions. Officer Skifton asked Alex the same questions and received the same answers. Officer Skifton and I agreed that detox would be the best place for Alex to go due to his level of intoxication. I radioed to dispatch to send Tri-State Ambulance for detox. Alex performed a PBT (Preliminary Breath Test) which yielded a result of .167 BrAC. Alex stated that it was his first time drinking to this extent. At that time Tri-State arrived on scene.

### Citation:

I completed Alex's citation for first offense UAL as Tri-State placed Alex into the ambulance. I was able to give Alex his citation and explain it, as well as his UWLPD Alcohol Diversion paperwork inside of the ambulance. I exited the ambulance after explaining the paperwork to Alex, ending out contact. Alex was transported to GLMC via Tri-State.

On the above date and time, I Officer Megan of the UW-La Crosse Police Department (UWLPD) was conducting a patrol of the Badger and 14th Street area on the UW-La Crosse Campus. I had been notified by the other officer on duty Officer Buhler during a previous stop that he observed two male individuals run from him while attempting a law enforcement contact. Officer Buhler described the individuals as one wearing a green shirt and the other wearing a dark-colored coat possibly black in color. At least one of the individuals was also wearing white shoes. The individuals were believed to possibly be related to the stop I had made.

I was in the area where the individuals were last seen after leaving a previous stop. At approximately 0127 hours I observed two male individuals that matched the above description, run westbound on Badger St. and turn south towards the main entrance of Angell Hall. After announcing myself as University Police the individuals were stopped in front of the main doors to Angell Hall. The individuals were identified as Peyton N. Stahl and Matthew Patrick Lee. They identified themselves by Wisconsin Drivers License and UWL Eagle ID.

Stahl and Lee were questioned about if they had been running from the police. Both Stahl and Lee denied running from the police. They also said they had no knowledge of the individual from a previous stop when asked. During the questioning, I observed that Stahl was slurring his speech. Stahl was also wearing a pink wristband which is given when a person is provided admittance to Latinos Bar in the city of La Crosse. I proceeded to ask if either one of them had been drinking earlier in the night. Both Stahl and Lee admitted to having consumed alcohol. Stahl and Lee were both asked if they would voluntarily consent to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT). Both Stahl and Lee declined to give consent and the test was not administered.

Stahl and Lee were told that they would be receiving citations for underage drinking. Lee admitted to the fact that he had been cited for the same offense earlier in January of 2024. Lee also said he had been given information on the Alcohol Diversion Class provided by the UWLPD at that time and had already signed up for it. Stahl was cited for WI Statute 125.07(4)(b) Underage Drinking-Possession 17-20 and provided with information on the Alcohol Diversion Class provided by the UWLPD. Lee was cited for WI Statute 125.07(4)(b) Underage Drinking-Possession 17-20 second offense and was not provided with information on the Alcohol Diversion Class.

#### Disposition:

Stahl and Lee were both given citations for WI Statute 125.07(4)(b) Underage Drinking- Possession 17-20. Stahl was provided with information on the Alcohol Diversion Class provided by the UWLPD. Lee was cited for his second offense.

#### CONTACT WITH ERIN HINTZ AND FRIENDS:

I contacted Erin Hintz who I identified by her Wisconsin drivers license. She stated she was friends with Colton. However, Erin and her friend stated they were not with Colton the whole night. Colton's friends stated he had a pitcher of rum and coke and a bouncer had to cut him off because he was drinking so much. Colton's friends stated they went to Tequila's first and then Colton went to Latinos bar next.

Erin was concerned for Colton and was wondering if we could get an ambulance to assess him. I advised Erin and her friends that due to Colton answering welfare questions correctly and knowing where he was that I cannot force him to go to the hospital. However, I did advise them if they wanted to take him to the hospital on their own they could, but I couldn't force Colton to go.

#### ASSISTANCE FROM THE LA CROSSE POLICE DEPARTMENT:

I asked dispatch if I could have a La Crosse Police Department officer respond to assist me due to me being the only UW-La Crosse Police Officer on at the time. I wanted a La Crosse Police Officer to come and stay with Colton while I issued him a citation for underage drinking and did not want him to try and get up while I was in my vehicle issuing the citation. I also wanted another officer in case he ended up needing medical attention.

Officer Boardman and Sgt. Plenge responded from the La Crosse Police Department to assist. Sgt Plenge advised that while I was gone he re assessed Colton and asked him basic welfare questions. Colton fell asleep and when he woke and Sgt. Plenge asked him questions he said the year was 2022 and still thought he was at Tequila's. However, Sgt. Plenge allowed for Colton to wake up a little bit more and Colton was able to answer the year was 2024 not 2022 and he was on the UW- La Crosse campus and he was in a Residential Hall on the campus.

Officer Boardman and Sgt. Plenge cleared from the call.

I issued Colton a citation for underage drinking first offense and offered Colton alcohol diversion through the UW-La Crosse

I asked her where she came from. She said she just wanted to go. I advised her she did not answer the question. Her friend Landon then said Laux Hall. I asked Abigail about her blue wristband. She and Landon stated it was from Latino's bar. I asked her how much she had to drink. She said not enough.

I asked her for her ID. She said she could not find her license, but she gave me her UWL ID. I asked her birthday. She initially did not want to respond. Several seconds later she provided her birthday. I ran her information through dispatch. Dispatch confirmed she was underage with no prior UALs.

friends Lily and Landon came to retrieve her because she was having a rough night. Lily and Landon are in a relationship and are Abigail's friends. I asked Abigail why she was sad and having a rough night. She stated lonely college life. I then asked her if she was having thoughts of harming herself. She stated no. I asked her if she was having thoughts of harming other. She said no. I encourage her to use the resources on campus. She said she was well aware of them because she recently wrote a paper about them.

Later, I asked her if she would consent to a PBT. Initially, she said yes. As I explained and demonstrated the test, she declined to participate. I later issued her a UAL 1st offense with alcohol diversion. The citation and diversion were explained. Abigail was cited and released to her friend, Lily.

#### Additional Information:

During my contact with the group, Landon's behavior was abnormal. His body movements were slow and awkward. He approached the driver's side of my squad while I typed the citation. After I told the group to stay in front of my squad, he just stood there. I advised him to return to the front of my squad. Based on the information I heard from the group, I believed Landon was a UWL student who lived at [redacted]. I asked dispatch to attempt to identify him.

Dispatch confirmed his identity on CBORD and informed me he was born in [redacted]. He was also underage and had consumed alcohol. It should also be noted. After I confronted Abigail about her wristband, I observed a blue wristband on the ground near Landon. Abigail still had her wristband. I asked for someone to pick it up and Landon did. He then placed it in his pocket.

After citing Abigail, I informed Landon I was going to ask him a question, which I knew the answer to. I asked Landon how old he was. He stated 22. I then asked him his birthday. He initially said 12/22/2001. I informed him that was not true. I asked him if he was underage. He hesitated and stated yes. I gave him a verbal warning for UAL 1st, due to him and his girlfriend coming to help their friend Abigail.

#### Disposition:

Abigail Galvin was cited and released for underage consumption 1st offense (UAL). Alcohol diversion was offered. Landon Karlen was verbally warned about his UAL 1st offense. No follow-up is needed.

### Initial Observation:

On October 26th, 2024, I patrolled the University of Wisconsin, La Crosse (UWL) campus and community. I was in an unmarked squad and in full uniform. As I drove north on West Avenue near Vine Street. I observed a male in a blue hoodie laying in the grass and male standing next to him. I turned around and they were still in the same location, but the standing male was now sitting next to the other. I radioed dispatch and initiated a welfare check at the location.

I verified Aidan's identity by his university photograph on CBORD. Aidan was breathing but was passed out in the grass with his eyes closed. I went over to him and called his name several times. He opened his eyes. He was able to provide his name, date of birth, address, what city he was in, and the river nearby.

I asked Aidan to sit up. He was able to with assistance. I was later assisted by UWL Officer Harkner. She retrieved a preliminary breath test (PBT). I asked Erik where they were coming from and he said, Latino's bar and he was just escorting his friend home. Erik also stated they were both UWL students.

Both Aidan and Erik had glossy red eyes. Aidan's breath emitted a strong odor of intoxicants. They both admitted to consuming alcohol and declined to take a PBT. They were both under the age of 21 and cannot consume or possess alcohol. Dispatch confirmed their age and stated this was their 1st offense.

Officer Harkner stood by with them while I wrote their citations for UAL 1st offense. As I wrote their citations I observed Aidan vomit on the sidewalk. I issued and explained their citations. I also offered them alcohol diversion. Both parties were cited and released.

### Additional Information:

Aidan did not want any medical assistance, and I did not believe he needed it. Due to Aidan's inability to walk home by himself. I instructed Officer Harkner to transport him home to \_\_\_\_\_, and I would follow. We escorted him to her squad. He consented to a frisk and was seat belted into the rear seat.

Once we arrived at his residence, I opened the rear squad door. He leaned out and vomited again. Once he was finished, we assisted him into his residence. His friends, including Erik, were inside. He was left with them.

#### Summary:

While on patrol I observed a female individual being carried by another individual on Pine St. Julia B. Blom and Josephine K. Sawicki were cited for underage drinking and offered the UW-La Crosse PD Alcohol Diversion Class.

#### Contact with Julia B. Blom and Josephine K. Sawicki:

On November 23, 2024, at 0145 hours while on patrol I observed a group of individuals walking eastbound on Pine St. A female individual in the group was being carried by a male individual. When the group saw my squad car they separated in different directions and I briefly lost sight of the individual being carried. I observed the individual again having difficulty walking up the stairs to the main doors of \_\_\_\_\_ Hall with another female individual.

I asked dispatch to check the name of the last person to enter \_\_\_\_\_ Hall. I was advised the individual was Josephine K Sawicki a resident of room \_\_\_\_\_. Contact was made with Sawicki and another heavily intoxicated individual identified as Julia A Blom in room \_\_\_\_\_. I asked Sawicki if they had been outside which she confirmed they had. I also advised that I had seen Blom being carried and having difficulty walking. Sawicki and Blom were wearing clothing that matched the individuals I observed entering \_\_\_\_\_ Hall. Sawicki also confirmed that it was them.

I asked both Sawicki and Blom if they had been drinking. Sawicki said no and Blom said she had. I asked Blom if she had any \_\_\_\_\_ of identification. Blom said yes and provided a Minnesota driver's license with the birthdate of \_\_\_\_\_. Dispatch was unable to get a return for Blom with a birth year of 2002. I asked Blom her birth year and she said \_\_\_\_\_. A return for an individual with the same name and birth year of \_\_\_\_\_ was confirmed by dispatch.

I asked Blom, who appeared to be heavily intoxicated, basic welfare questions. Blom was able to successfully answer that she was in La Crosse, WI; however, she continued to use that answer for other questions, including the name of her hometown. Blom is from Minnesota, as shown on her driver's license information. Blom was also asked what the current year was; she responded 2028 and was also unable to name the Mississippi River when asked.

I asked Blom if she would consent to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT). Blom gave consent and several attempts were made to conduct the PBT. The PBT was unsuccessful as Blom was unable to blow successfully into the tube. During the test, I observed Blom had difficulty following simple instructions.

After attempting to get a successful PBT result, I requested Tri-State Ambulance through dispatch to evaluate Blom and possibly provide transport to detox. Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) from Tri-State evaluated Blom. During the evaluation, Blom was able to correctly state the current year and said she lived in room \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_ Hall. Blom is not a student at UW-La Crosse. Blom also said she was 19 when she was 18. I explained to one of the EMTs that Blom had provided completely different answers approximately ten minutes prior to their arrival. Sawicki told the EMTs that they had been at Latinos Bar. With further questioning, Blom admitted to having 4 or 5 Vodka and Cranberry mixed drinks. Tri-State asked Blom if she wanted to go to the hospital. Blom said no and that she would stay with Sawicki who agreed to watch for any further issues.

After hearing Sawicki state that they had been at Latinos I asked again if she had been drinking. This time Sawicki admitted to having one or two drinks. I asked Sawicki if she would consent to a PBT to which Sawicki declined. While speaking more directly with Sawicki her speech was slurred.

During the call I also had contact with an uninvolved individual who was concerned about Blom's welfare and if she made it home. The individual was friends with Blom and was able to answer questions about where Blom was from originally.

#### Disposition:

Sawicki and Blom were cited for WI 125.07(4)(b) Underage Drinking/Possession. They were referred to the Alcohol Diversion Class provided by the UW-La Crosse Police Department. Blom was warned about having a fake ID card in her possession. The fake ID Blom provided was seized and taken to the UW-La Crosse Police Department.

I advised UWLPD Dispatch to have Tri-State Ambulance respond non-emergent to my location, for a possible alcohol detoxification.

### ARRIVAL OF TRI-STATE AMBULANCE

Leen was evaluated in the back of the ambulance. Paramedics decided Leen was not well enough to go to her residence hall (Angell Hall). Tri-State Ambulance transported Leen to Gundersen Hospital for alcohol detoxification. A Preliminary Breath Test was not offered to Leen due to her intoxicated state.

### SUMMARY

Lily Cottrell (identified by Wisconsin Driver's License) and Johannah Seifert (identified by Wisconsin Driver's License) were issued UAL 1st Offense and offered UWLPD Alcohol Diversion Program.

### INITIAL OBSERVATIONS

On the above date and time, I (Officer Andrew Dahl) was sitting on the corner of Badger Street and Oakland Street when I observed a group walking eastbound on Badger Street. One of the individuals left the group and started walking northbound on Oakland Street, this behavior left the group confused. I started following the individual northbound on Oakland Street and observed the individual made a turn into lot R-8 and started walking between cars to evade me. I asked Seifert's roommate if she had contact with Seifert for the Police were looking for her.

### SECOND CONTACT

Cameras showed Seifert going to the basement after swiping into Hall. An attempt to locate Seifert in the basement was attempted but unsuccessful.

I attempted contact at Seifert's room again. As I approached the door, I could hear two individuals talking through the door. The individual talking said "They asked where Josie was, and I said I didn't know. I was so drunk, and they didn't even do anything." I contacted the individuals Johanna Seifert and her roommate, Lily Cottrell. I explained to Cottrell that I heard their conversation through the door, and I heard she was drunk. When I asked Seifert how much she had to drink she said not much, looked at Cottrell, then said 3 drinks. A Preliminary Breath Test was performed on Cottrell and Seifert. Seifert had a BrAC of 063. Cottrell had a BrAC of .205. Both Seifert and Cottrell claimed they were at Latinos Bar. Due to Cottrell's high BrAC level I asked Seifert to monitor her.

### DISPOSITION

Seifert and Cottrell were cited for UAL 1st Offense and offered UWLPD Alcohol Diversion Program.

I also observed red stains on James' pants which was determined to be a stain the leaves left on him when he was sitting.

I transported James to Angel Hall, where Tommy and Tyler Mortell reside. Tyler's roommate, Jaxon Bowens answered and attempted to contact Tyler Mortell. After phone contact with Sergeant Nikki Miller, it was determined James could be left with Tyler Mortell's roommates if they agreed to him staying.
