I am writing to urge you to reject Mayor Rich Reynolds' appeal of the Historic Landmark Designation of the South Branch Library.

The designation has properly moved through the established channels; neighbors have gathered and educated themselves, a nomination was developed by a local preservation expert, and the Heritage Preservation Commission (HPC) reviewed the nomination documentation and approved the designation. For there to be doubt of the validity of the HPC's support of the designation is to question the qualifications and intentions of the Mayor's own appointees.
