- To right of driveway (from street) 45 ft long by 5 ft wide
  - Plantings inset 1 ft from surrounding sidewalks/street planting area 43ft long by 3 ft wide

Maintenance Plan: How will the project area be maintained? Applicant is responsible for

general maintenance including weeding, watering, trimming, and removal of excess material.

- Site will be initially prepared by laying down cardboard to smother grass and covering with dirt, compost, and mulch.
- Native seeds and/or plants will be sown/planted directly into dirt/mulch
- Boulevard plantings will be maintained by trimming plants as needed to keep sidewalk/street clear and also by weeding, watering, (outdoor faucet and hose in front of house) and adding mulch as needed.
- Plants will be left standing through fall & winter to allow native pollinators to overwinter until nighttime temps are routinely >50. Then will clean up and compost detritus in spring.
- Some plants may require trimming not to exceed the 30" height requirement for boulevard plantings.
  - Lead plant (seed)
  - Blue stemmed goldenrod (seed)
  - Button blazing star (bare root)
