Department Highlights:

- None to report for the month of February.



Notable Incidents:

- February 13th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 919 Redfield Street at 1:40 pm. Crews arrived to find heavy smoke on one side of a duplex. They made forcible entry and were able to quickly extinguish the fire that started within the kitchen. Occupants of the unit were not home at the time and the neighboring occupants were able to evacuate safely. The fire was caused by heat from the stove top being left on.
- February 15th, LCFD responded to a garage fire at 1718 Market Steet at 6:52 pm. Crews arrived on scene in less than four minutes and fire exhausting from the roof of a garage. Firefighters were able to quickly established fire control and began overhaul as the structure was fully involved and had began to cause heat damage to neighboring houses. No injuries were reported and the cause of the fire at this time is undetermined.
