In the News:

July 4th, LCFD responded to a shed fire on the City's northside, arriving within three minutes. The shed, located six-feet away from an apartment building, was fully engulfed in flames but thankfully crews were able to keep the fire contained to the building of origin.

July 28th, LCFD were called to the bike trails at Upper Hixon Forest for a patient who fell and hit his/her head. Crews utilized the UTV to safely extricate the patient from the trail.

July 29th, Chief Ken Gilliam delivered (while wearing a mask and practicing social distancing) Lifesaver Awards to four community members who helped save a 5-year-old girl from drowning earlier this summer at Black River Beach.

July 31st, LCFD responded to a structure fire at Solberg Heights, arriving within two minutes. Crews located a small fire on the stove in a unit on the sixth floor. The fire was quickly extinguished and the apartment sustained minimal damage. No injuries were reported.






LCFD Incident Responses By Month





Total Training Hours Per Firefighter in July 2020





"Thank You"

On Saturday, 11th, 2020, I fell in my laundry room at my independent living apartment at Eagle Crest South in LaCrosse. Within 5-10 minutes of calling 911, five paramedics from the LaCrosse Fire Department arrived at Eagle Crest South. They came directly to the 5th floor to my apartment. They evaluated my situation and asked how I fell as I could not get up on my own. I told them that I had fallen by doing the splits on a wet floor in the laundry room and injured my right hip. Two of the 5 paramedics from the LaCrosse Fire Department lifted me upright to a standing position. One of them, a very nice young man held me upright until I could stand without feeling dizzy. He then, gently moved me over to a chair to be seated while the 2 EMT's from Gundersen Ambulance Service checked my vital signs. Since I could not stand on my own without severe pain in my right hip and numbness in the lower leg and ankle, it was suggested I go to the hospital to be evaluated and possible x-rays. I was then transported to Mayo Clinic Emergency Department.

Once the paramedics from the LaCrosse Fire Department helped me on to the waiting stretcher, they all left as they had helped me all they could. I did not get a chance to "thank" them for their excellent service in responding to the "fall" I had taken in my apartment. I forgot their names, but they know who they are. I want them to know how grateful I am to have such responsible, professional paramedics working for the LaCrosse Fire Department.. They are an excellent representative of the quality of care offered to the public by the Fire Department in the LaCrosse area. Please "thank" them for me.
