Police Department Monthly Report

Community Engagement

Recently, two officers received commendation for their part in organizing a community resource connection event. Sergeant Steve Curns and Officer Alex Burg, as well as the entire Neighborhood Resource Officer team worked with area service and resource providers to come together in one spot in an effort to connect our area homeless population with services. The event was a great success – they were able to connect three people with rehabilitation/housing services, six people with the Salvation Army, and numerous others were enrolled in other programs.

Later this month, our Department, together with the Fire Department, La Crosse County Health Department, and University of Wisconsin – La Crosse, will be handing out bags with safety messaging to off-campus housing tenants. The bags will include a flyer from each entity with safety messaging and contact information, as well as masks for the individuals to use.

Communication and Transparency

When our Department released our “La Crosse Police Department: Policies and Practices in 21st Century Policing” publication, there were several areas for improvement identified as part of our comprehensive review of our General Orders Policy Manual. Last week, we updated and trained several policies as follows:

- Added language to the “Use of Force” policy that prohibits the use of any neck restraint unless there is a threat of death or great bodily harm NOTE: Neck restraints were prohibited in 2015 by internal memorandum, but the prohibition was not documented in policy.
- Added language to the “Use of Force” policy requiring IMMEDIATE notification to a supervisor of any excessive use of force witnessed by staff.
- Added language to the “Biased Based Profiling” policy to include information and guidance when responding to calls dealing with “bias by proxy”.
- Required all staff to complete a policy review of the aforementioned policy updates and acknowledge their review of the changes.
- Required all field staff to receive refresher training in “Fair and Impartial Policing”.
- Become a contributor to the State of Wisconsin and Federal Bureau of Investigation use of force databases.

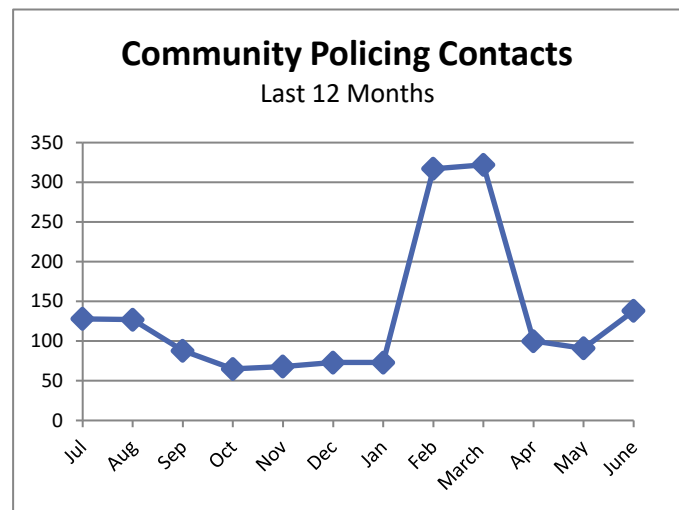
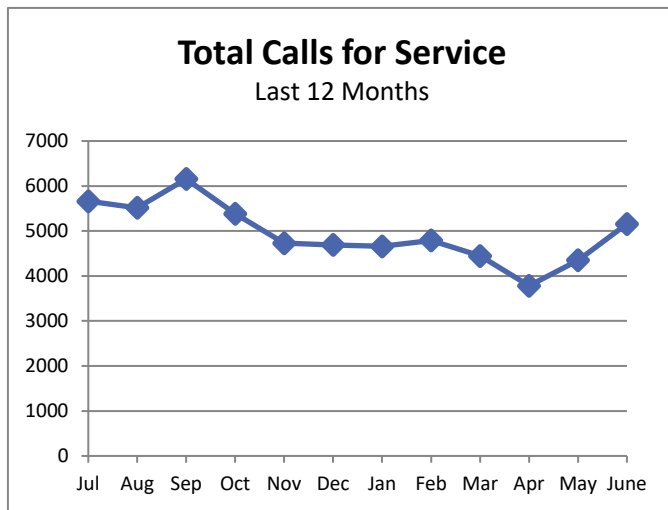

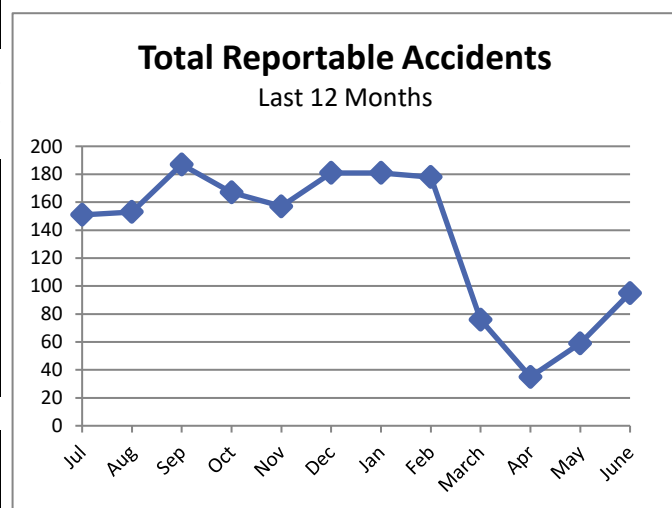
