Pursuant to the Provisions of Wis. Stat. S. 84.30(5r), a courtesy copy of which is attached for reference, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) proposes to realign a sign located on the above-described lands. The realignment of the sign will be on the same real estate site. The sign conforms to state law, but the Department understands that the sign is a nonconforming structure under local ordinances. Under s. 84.30(5r), realignment of the sign will not affect its nonconforming status under your jurisdiction's local ordinances.

You may petition the Department to acquire the sign rather than realign it. If you petition the Department to acquire the sign, it will do so at the time it acquires the land needed for the highway project involved. A petitioning local government, however, is responsible for any cost of acquiring the sign above and beyond the cost to WisDOT of realigning the sign, which would include possible loss in value to the real estate parcel.

We estimate WisDOT's cost to realign the sign to be: +/- \$2,000.

Because a decision to realign or acquire the sign must be made before the real estate involved is appraised and acquired by WisDOT, it is essential that we receive a prompt response from you regarding this matter. Please respond to this notice within 60 days so that the department may proceed with its real estate acquisition in a timely fashion. You may inform WisDOT of your intentions by simply indicating your jurisdiction's preference below.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED REALIGNMENT OF SIGN, WISCONSIN SATUTORY PROVISION

- (5r) SIGNS NONCONFORMING UNDER LOCAL ORDINANCES THAT ARE REALIGNED BECAUSE OF STATE HIGHWAY PROJECTS.
- (a) In this subsection, "realignment" means relocation on the same site.
- (b) If a highway project of the department causes the realignment of a sign that does not conform to a local ordinance, the realignment shall not affect the sign's nonconforming status under the ordinance.
- (c) If in connection with a highway project of the department the department proposes the realignment of a sign that does not conform to a local ordinance, the department shall notify the governing body of the municipality or county where the sign is located and which adopted the ordinance of the sign's proposed realignment. Upon receiving this notice, the governing body may petition the department to acquire the sign and any real property interest of the sign owner. If the department succeeds in condemning the sign, the governing body that made the petition to the department shall pay to the department an amount equal to the condemnation award, less relocation costs for the sign that would have been paid by the department if the sign had been realigned rather than condemned. Notwithstanding s. 86.30 (2) 1. and (b) 1., 1g., and 1r., if the governing body fails to pay this amount, the department may reduce the municipality's or county's general transportation aid payment under s. 86.30 by an equal amount.
- (d) This subsection does not permit the alteration or movement of a sign that is nonconforming under this section.

As you are aware, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) and City of La Crosse are conducting the above highway project along USH 14/South Avenue in the City of La Crosse. As part of the real estate process, one additional on-premise sign will be affected. WisDOT proposes to realign this sign on the remaining lands of the owner pursuant to the provisions of s. 84.30(5r), Stats., in order to avoid any possible damages to the real property resulting from the loss of the signs. A notice to that effect for each sign is included with this letter.

Per Wis. Stat. s. 84.30(5r), you are required to decide whether the City of La Crosse will allow the sign to be moved on the same parcel, so that the sign can be realigned on the owner's remaining property, or request WisDOT to acquire the sign structure. If the city requests WisDOT to acquire the sign, WisDOT will be responsible for the cost of moving the structure or cost to acquire the structure, whichever is less. All remaining costs resulting from the acquisition of the sign would be paid by the City of La Crosse, including any loss in value to the to the owner's real estate caused by the elimination of the sign. See Wis. Stat. s. 84.30(5r)(c).
