So, suffice it to say, I take saving our built heritage seriously. Preservation Alliance of La Crosse has been working hard for the past several weeks trying to show the Fire Chief, the Mayor, the City Council members, and the residents of La Crosse that we can have a NEW fire station on Gillette Street, AND still save the existing, historic and architecturally significant Fire Station #4 from demolition so it can be rehabbed for a different, new use. The Fire Chief and the Mayor have both recently indicated that they would be willing to look at alternatives which preserve the historic fire station, however, with the CUP for the demolition of Fire Station #4 on this month's Common Council agenda, those expressions of willingness to look at alternatives don't make sense and the CUP is not in keeping with trying to work with saving the building.
