Police Department Monthly Report

Employee Recognition

The past month has been full of opportunities for our Department to highlight the good work of our Officers. In two recent Facebook posts, two Officers were highlighted for their efforts in "paying it forward" to members of our community. In both cases, their actions would have gone unknown if not for others bringing it to the attention of supervisory staff. In one case, an Officer responded to a Trouble with Party call. After easing tensions with all parties, the Officer realized that one individual had a bus ticket to return to family, but didn't have a reliable ride to the depot. Our Officer offered up a ride, and even purchased food for the individual so they had something to eat during their travels. Another Officer responded to a call where an individual had taken a cab ride, but didn't have the money to pay for the fare. The Officer decided to pay for the fare for the individual. In highlighting these two Officers on our Facebook, nearly 150,000 people were reached and over 500 people commented with words of gratitude and support.

Along with these acts of kindness, this week we are honoring several members of our Department and the community as part of our Annual Awards/Recognition program. Though we would traditionally host a public gathering and ceremony, due to COVID, we have moved this celebration to our Facebook page (<u>www.facebook.com/lacrossepolice</u>). Join us on our page as we celebrate the 12 officers and 10 civilians who were nominated by members of our department and have received awards for their actions that go above and beyond.


