May LCFD Highlights:

- May 8th, LCFD in partnership with the American Red Cross and support from Great Rivers United Way, participated in the "Sound the Alarm. Save a Life." event held at Copeland Park.
- May 9th, LCFD responded to a garage fire at 1251 Farnam Street at 6:51pm. Crews arrived within four minutes to find heavy smoke coming from a small two-car, detached garage. The fire was contained to a corner of the garage, on the ground level with heavy smoke and moderate fire damage. No injuries were reported. LCFD had eight apparatus and 17 personnel on scene with assistance from Xcel Energy and HAFD.
- May 13th, LCFD responded to a fire at 903 Tyler Street at 6:44pm. Upon arrival, crews observed smoke coming from a two-story residential duplex and were able to extinguish the fire by 6:56pm. No occupants were home during the time of the fire, but there were three dogs that had perished. The occupancy sustained moderate to heavy smoke damage and heavy smoke damage. Two families were displaced and receiving assistance from the Red Cross. LCFD had nine apparatus and 21 personnel on scene. Assistance was also provided by LCPD, TSA, HAFD, and Xcel Energy. The fire is still under investigation.
- May 15th, LCFD responded to Grandad Bluff Road for a biker who had fallen and was injured at 7:59pm. The first crews
 arrived on scene at 8:08pm and were able to locate the patient below one of the trails by 8:20pm. The patient was
 extricated from the steep trail and hillside to the parking area with technical rescue equipment. LCFD had seven
 apparatus and twelve personnel on scene. Assistance was also provided by LCFD and TSA.
- May 18th-20th, LCFD Fire Investigators along with LCPD, Onalaska Fire Department, and the La Crosse County Sheriff's Department attended an Interview and Interrogation class led by Retired FBI agent Pat Kelly at Stoney Creek.
- May 27th, with the help of the La Crosse Bantry Friendship Association, Chief Gilliam and Chief Ian Vickery (from Bantry Ireland) were able to meet via virtual conferencing which was broadcasted live on Facebook.







Apparatus Average Response Time (HH:MM:SS)




