August LCFD Highlights:

- August 9th, LCFD presented the Lifesaver Award to LCPD officers Dakota Marcon and Hayden Halverson for their quick action in applying two tourniquets to a patient who had a severe laceration that resulted in a severed artery. This action resulted in saving the patient's life!
- August 16th, LCFD responded to medical emergency call on a hiking trail at 700 County Road FA. Upon arrival, crews made contact with bystanders and were directed to patient who was approximately .25 mile into the trail. LCFD USAR members prepared to evacuate the patient by using a slope evacuation system. TSA was also on scene and assisted with transport and patient care. A total of twelve LCFD personnel were on scene.
- August 23rd, LCFD personnel mitigating an oil leak after a car fire near Ace Hardware on the southside. Quint 3 and Rescue 3 were able to extinguish the fire shortly after arriving on scene. The vehicle was leaking oil that was flowing into a nearby sewer drain. Personnel quickly built a berm with Oil-Dri and dirt from the area to contain the leak and then used absorbent pads to soak up the oil.





Apparatus 90th Percentile Response Time (HH:MM:SS)



July LCFD Highlights:

- July 7th, LCFD responded to a house fire at 1803 George Street at 8:31pm. Crews arrived to the condemned house and found heavy smoke and fire coming from a second story window. The fire was quickly extinguished and there were no occupants located. Assistance to this incident was received from the LCPD, Xcel Energy, and TSA.
- July 13th, LCFD responded to a call at 7:54pm for two people stranded on some logs while tubing down the La Crosse River. Crews arrived on scene to N3315 State Road 16 within six minutes of being dispatched. Using the Rapid Deployment Craft, the two people were safely brought to shore by 8:11pm. LCFD had ten personnel on scene and were assisted by the La Crosse County Sheriff's Department and the La Crosse County Dive Team.
- July 20th, LCFD christened it's newest apparatus, Quint 1, and held a dedication ceremony in honor of Engineer James McCormick who lost his life in the line of duty in 1957.
- July 20th, LCFD responded to a vehicle accident/rollover at the intersection of Market Street and 6th Street South. This was during the dedication ceremony mentioned above, only a block away, so crews were able to respond within a minute or less. The occupants of the vehicle were able to get out on their own and no injuries were reported.






