Sleznikow gave a brief presentation. Van Maren compared it to putting a value or price on clean air. Brever asked for clarification on the fee and how it is returned. Tyser asked how it compares to past cap and trade proposals. Sleznikow responded that is much less prone to manipulation and is simpler. Diermeier asked about consumer impact. Sleznikow responded that increase in cost would be offset by dividend.

Van Maren made a motion, Cornforth seconded, to approve this resolution. The motion carried by voice vote.

Maren felt that a MOU would be encouraging for utilities to know that Cities and Counties supported it. Commission asked staff to research why Dane County didn't pursue a MOU. Tyser asked about including Onalaska. Staff suggested starting with the La Crosse and inviting people after that got started.

Lenard made a motion, Thompson seconded, that the City and County pursue a memorandum of understanding with Xcel Energy and possibly Dairyland Power. The motion carried by a voice vote.

Giese suggested splitting out the discussion on an idling policy from the alternative transportation discussion. Nichols suggested that sheriffs dept. could be a good collaborator on enforcing idling policy. Brever met with Streets, who requested a seasonal exemption; suggested exempting police and fire. Giese requested model ordinances from GTLC. Van Maren recommends policy apply to all citizens. Bertrand mentioned the importance of education, that people need to care first. Van Maren agreed that promoting safety and cost benefits would help.

Tyser requested volunteers to report back on lessons learned from forums. Van Maren and Bertrand volunteered for alternative transportation; Diermeier and Cornforth volunteered for recycling.
