What is the Campbell Road Bikeway? Campbell has no bike infrastructure, aside from being a very wide street that people drive too fast on. Are greenways defined somewhere? For streets that are marked as such now, there's a very inconsistent experience. King is in decent shape until 17th street, and then the roadway is very much in need of a full bump grind and partial reconstruction from there to 20th. Where greenways cross other major streets, sometimes there are marked crossings like across West Ave, but then nothing going across Cass. Jackson/SR 33 is badly in need of some kind of protection for its bike lanes as I frequently see cars, trucks, even city vehicles driving partially in the bike lanes with no spatial awareness. Even just a rumble strip next to the bike lane would help. Please avoid on-street 2-way cycle tracks - having cyclists going two directions on one side of the road is too much for drivers barely watching for them traveling in one direction. Cass from West to 7th remains a mess going westbound - the bumpouts just create shoulders that get treated like parking which is never enforced, and bikes must constantly drift towards the center to avoid hitting the bump outs.
