### 2. Project Description

We would like to create a gallery show from a set of photographs that we took in 2020. The photographs depict handwritten notes that were found in the big cottonwood tree in Myrick Park. This story gets started off with a zip loc bag that contains a stack of notes in it. The outside of the bag reads "for everyone who loves the tree". Upon opening the bag, we found an introductory letter from a girl named Alice as well as a number of other letters replying to Alice, or simply speaking to the tree directly. When we took these photos we posted them to Reddit and they were so well received, with everyone asking where they could find the "big magical tree". Seeing as both the story and tree are local to us, we think that a lot of people in our community will be touched and intrigued by this photo set. There are a total of 19 photos, 17 of them are letters, one is the outside of the bag that was holding the letters with writing on it, and the last one is of the tree itself.






