1. Project Location

2. Project Description

The WHY. Over the last decade I have had a growing interest in bugs and entomology. Growing up in the rolling hills of Central Wisconsin I was surrounded by the sites and sounds of these little wonders. While they gave me the typical childhood "ick," as an adult, bugs have become a unique fascination. Their critical roll in the ecological process as pollinators, food sources, and decomposers have given me a great appreciation for them... even if they still give me the occasional 'ick."

My goal is to bring attention to the outsized roll bugs play in pollination and crop production, as well as being the predominant food source for many other creatures. Beyond this I am fascinated by the roll insects play in the decomposition of plant/animal matter, and returning nutrients to the soil to support future plant growth. Put simply I believe that without bugs we would be screwed, and I want others to understand that as well.

I have selfishly wanted to paint a mural that focuses on bugs/pollinators for several years now. My recent move to the Driftless Area has motivated me even more to find a wall for this idea. I worry about how fragile our world is, and I want use my art to bring awareness to the importance of our entomological ecosystems.

The broad concept of my mural is to create a decorative insect pinning wall. Insect pinning or taxidermy is a familiar visual for most people, and a unique way of presenting these creatures that I have never seen before in mural form. It is also an academic viewpoint of insects which would naturally lend itself to adding an educational aspect to the mural. My initial idea would be to add QR codes for each insect that would link to educational resources on pollinators, individual insects, local ecosystems, and the land that supports them. I would want to partner with educators to guide me on this aspect of the mural. Im sure there are other ways this could be done and I would be excited to get feedback from educators on this.

I dont want to paint the "pretty" insects exclusively. Think butterflies, bees, and moths. The "not so pretty" insects, like beetles and flies, also deserve attention. I would focus on an illustration style that adds additional color and decorative elements to these insects so they are just as fun and playful as their naturally brilliant cousins. I am envisioning 10-20 different illustrations for the wall.
