












Building La Crosse's proposed bikeway network could provide positive economic benefits for the region. Over a 20-year period, the proposed bikeway network could provide residents with \$281 million to \$299 million in total economic benefits, including:


Building high-quality bicycle infrastructure impacts La Crosse's bottom line by helping reduce the cost of healthcare, preventing expensive collisions, creating more low-cost travel options, reducing air pollutants, and supporting local businesses. This economic impact analysis quantifies how La Crosse's existing bikeways benefit residents in the region and looks at how a fully built out bikeway network could further contribute to amounts.1 the local economy.

That said, even with extensive primary and secondary research included in this analysis, it is not possible to accurately forecast the exact impacts of all bicyclerelated factors. Accordingly, some qualitative benefits of bicycling aren't included, and all estimated benefits are rounded and should be considered rough order of magnitude estimates instead of precise

To Whom it May Concern:

The City of La Crosse Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC), expresses support for La Crosse Neighborhoods, Inc. efforts to develop a bike share program in La Crosse. The mission of the BPAC is to implement the 2012 Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. This plan was organized around the Five Es of a bicycle friendly community; Engineering, Education, Encouragement, Enforcement and Evaluation. Implementation of a bike share program was established as a benchmark for the Encouragement category. The stated goal is to, "Increase access to existing bike sharing programs or consider developing a new one."

Implementation of bike share would further align with the City of La Crosse's sustainability goals. The 2009 City and County of La Crosse Strategic Plan for Sustainability, recommends "Exploring a partnership with an existing bike sharing program to reduce the amount of fossil fuels used by employees in order to get to and from work." In 2019 the City of La Crosse Common Council adopted Resolution 19-0471 which stated "Achieve municipality and community carbon neutrality by 2050 with incremental drawdown targets of 5% by 2020, 20% by 2025, 30% by 2030, 45% by 2035, 60% by 2040, 80% by 2045, and 100% by 2050. Encouraging bicycling and walking is a priority in the 2002 La Crosse Comprehensive Plan. The guiding principle of the Comprehensive Plan is "Smart Growth." Smart growth, "aims to accommodate development while protecting key resources, use land more efficiently, promote housing choice, reduce driving and promote walking bicycling and transit ridership."

Bike share aligns with and facilitates many of the stated goals and adopted plans of the; City of La Crosse Common Council, City of La Crosse BPAC, 2002 Confluence Comprehensive Plan, 2009 City and County of La Crosse Strategic Plan for Sustainability, and 2012 Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan.

It is for these stated reasons that the City of La Crosse Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee endorses the efforts of La Crosse Neighborhoods, Inc. to develop and implement a bike share program in the City of La Crosse.




TOTAL FREE & PAID RIDES BY MONTH - 2022 VS 2023




% of Visits Per Station 2023









Number of Visits Per Station 2023 (*new)
